Recent Rains Are **Beneficial To Grains and Pasture**

Prospects for small grains cover crops and pastures were improved over most of the eastern half of the State as drought conditions were partially relieved by light to moderate rains. Moisture was sufficient in these areas to germinate small grains that were not yet sprouted and crops that were up to a stand were making some growth. More rain is still needed over much of this area. The wheat crop was holding out well in the northern three tiers of counties in the High Plains, but in the southern High Plains and most of the Low Rolling Plains, the crop was suffering as the dry weather continued.

Winter pasture feed prospects improved over the eastern half of the State as light rains temporarily relieved the critical drought. Rain was generally too light to be of lasting benefit except in central Blackland and northeastern counties where some run-off partially replenished stock water supplies. Clovers, rescue grass and small grains were making renewed growth in the area favored by rain, but more rain as needed over practically the entire state. Wheat was supplying fair to good pasture in the northern two tiers of Panhandle counties, but elsewhere in the main wheat areeas wheat pasture was limited. Supplemental feeding continued over most of the state.


