## Victor Hotel To Have Formal Opening Sunday

### Most Army Officer Requirements Filled

The Army announced that with a few exceptions, the current of officer requirements are now filled. The exceptions are Medical, Chaplain and Judge Advocate General offices.

According to Oscar B. Abbott, Executive for the Texas Military District, during the past year the Army has campaigned to obtain Organized Reserve Corps and National Guard officers back into the army on a three year tour of extended active duty. Approximately 40,000 reserve officers are now on extended active duty with the Army.

Great need still exists in the Army for Medical Corps, Dental Service Corps and Army Nurse Corps in all grades except Colonels. Vacancies also remain in the grade of First Lieutenant for Chaplains and the Judge Advocate General's Department.

Second Lieutenants of all arms may continue to volunteer for extended active duty. Selections will be based on the individuals record and efficiency.

Girls County Basketball tournament planned. Recently the coaches of the girls basketball teams in the county met at the Baird High School and laid plans for a county tournament.

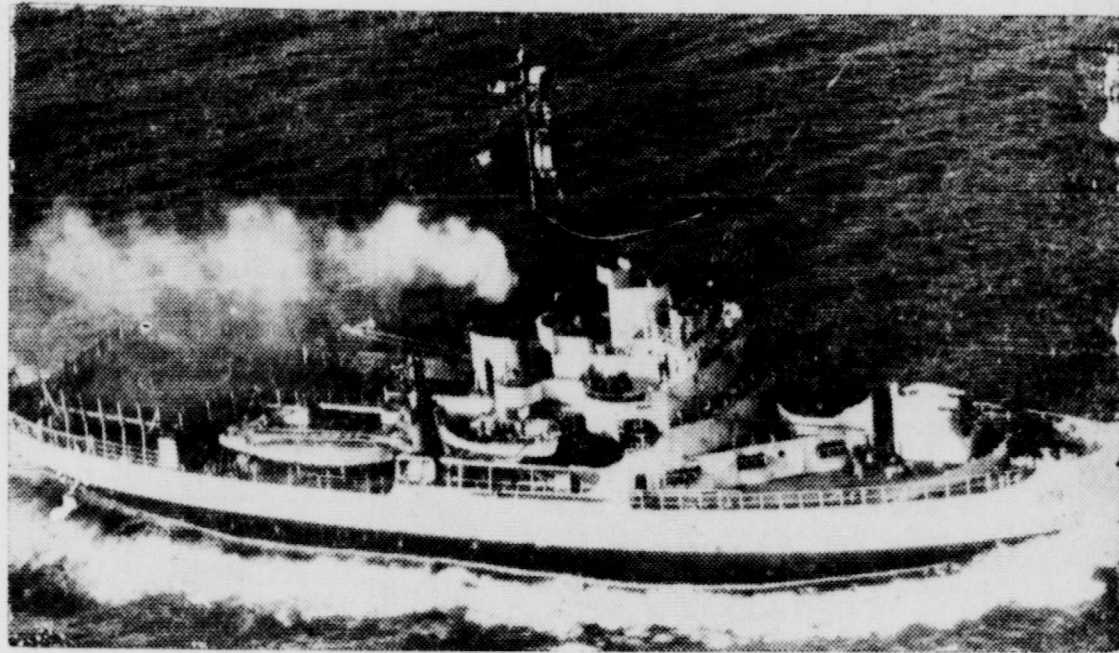

### W. H. LaRogue Tells Rotarians The Seriousness Of Russia's "Cold War"

W. L. LaRogue, former newspaperman and active civic leader here, told members of the Cisco 81st Congress faces a gigantic Rotary club Thursday at the junior college cafeteria that "the problem in mending the United States Foreign Policy toward Russia and her satellites."

Mr. LaRogue's appearance as a guest speaker was arranged by Rotarian A. E. McNeeley, program chairman for today's luncheon.

"Russia," he contended, "is standing by, poised for the attack, after the United States is torn down by a financial depression. When that time comes, Joe Stalin will turn his Cold War, now ravaging China, Greece, and France, into the world's most terrifying conflict.

"Communism is thriving today in countries where poverty and lack of education and breeding has enveloped its people. In Greece for instance, people are desperately fighting off Red guerilla bands. And China, a country which holds one-fourth of the world's population, is being swept up into Communist control."

The speaker, introduced by Rotarian McNeeley, after an informal luncheon, asserted that "the American public, Texans alike, should keep in contact with their representatives in Washington, suggesting to them what Foreign measures to favor.

"We in the United States cannot neglect these foreign problems since their overlook would be our downfall. America can no longer rest assured that the nations of South America, unsettled today as they are, will be our allies in case of another war. They are our allies so long as we lend them money, and he declared, the government cannot continue dishonoring out money without taxing the public even more than it has done in the past."

The speaker did not offer any solution for the problem but listed several alternatives.

President J. E. Proctor, who presided at the luncheon, announced that Rotarians Elsworth Mayner and Lonnie Shockley had been named to the annual football banquet committee this year.

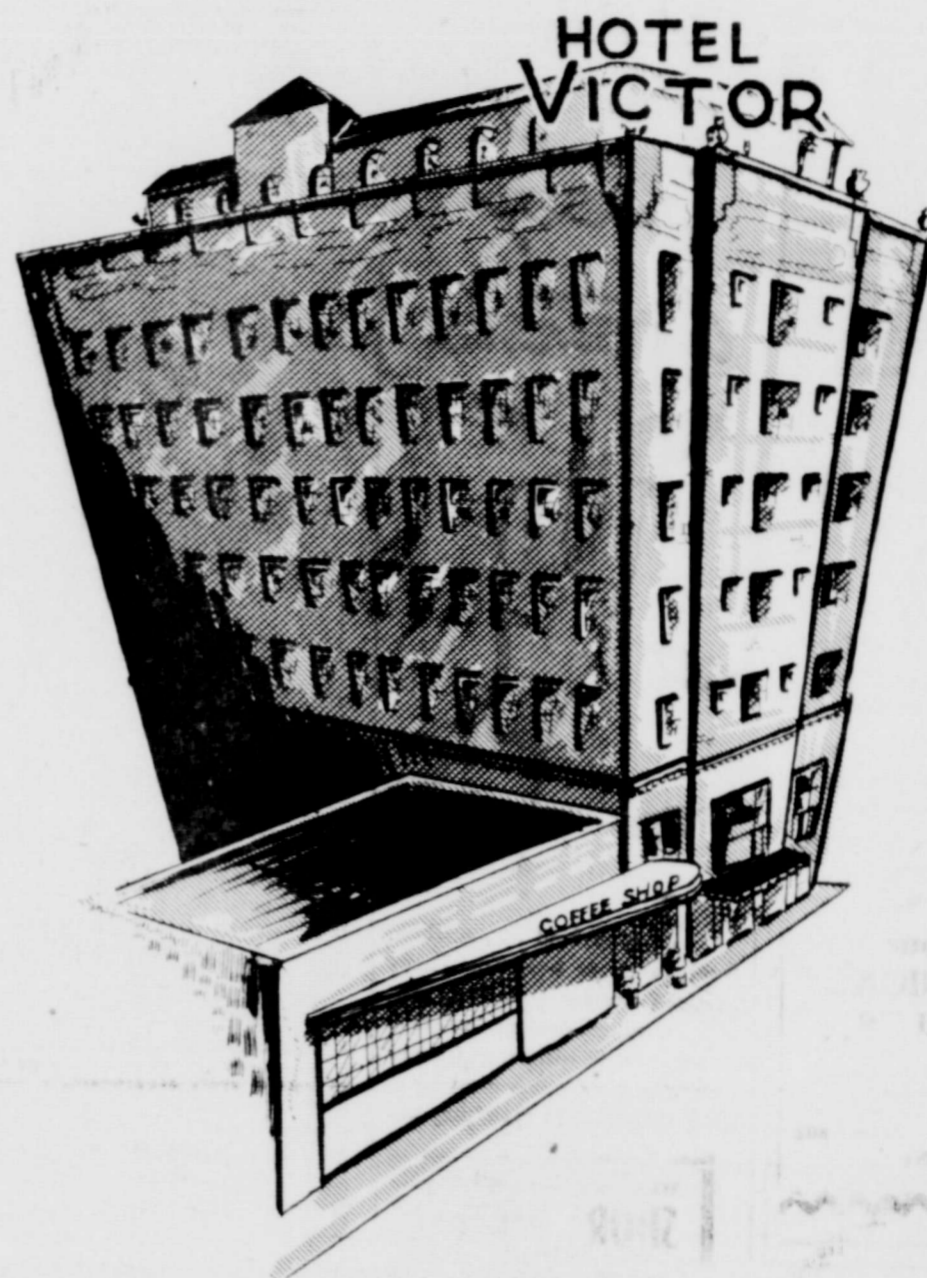
