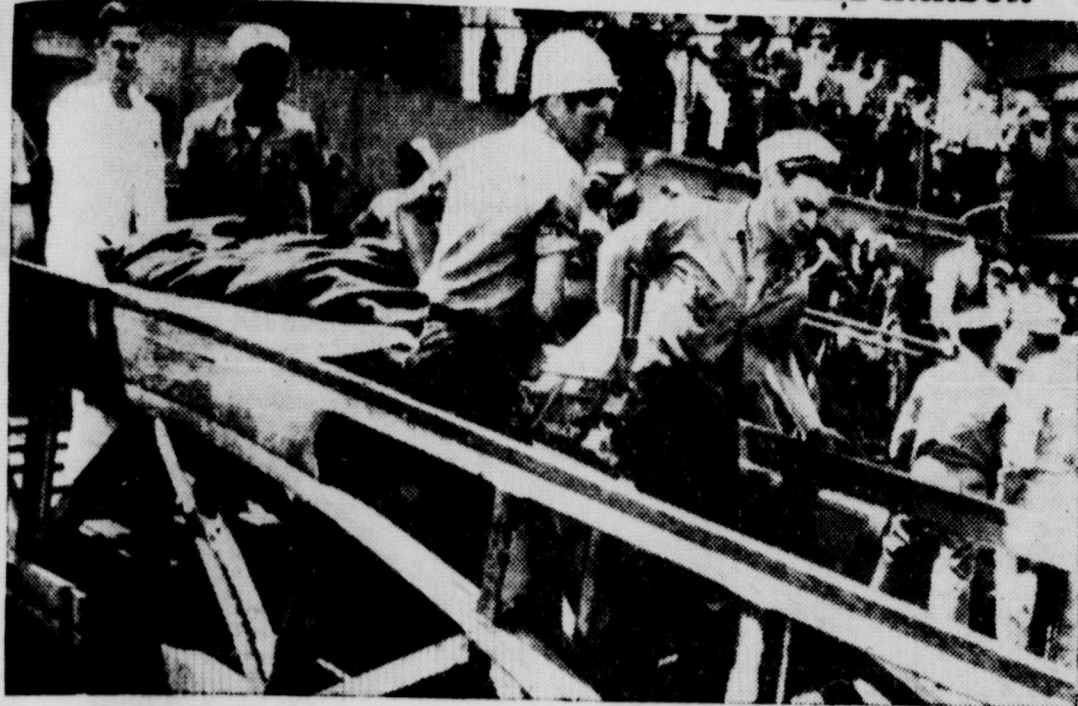

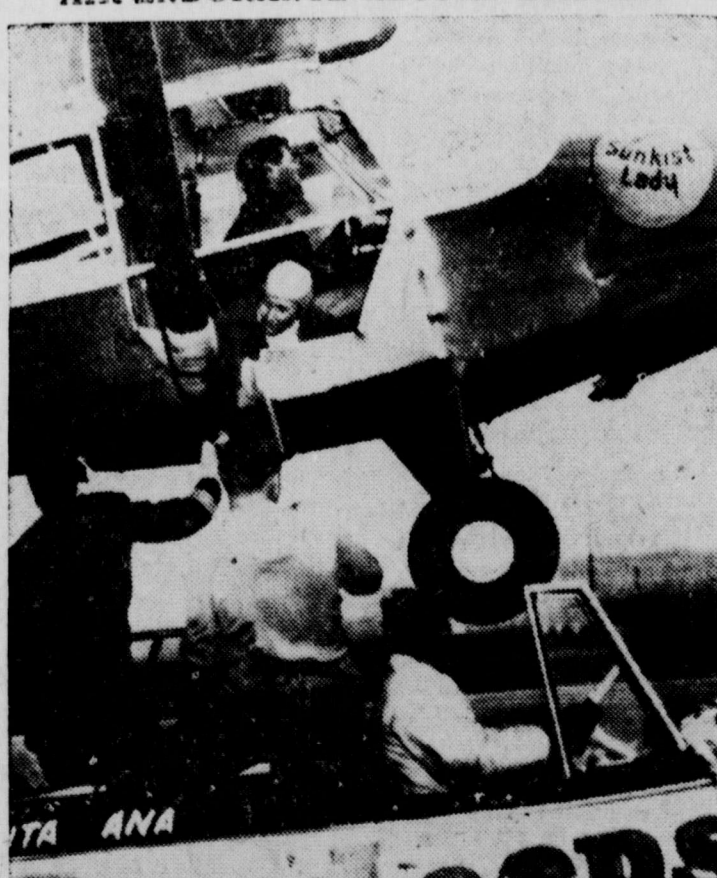
Local High School Band Goes To San Antonio For Annual Battle of Flowers Festival And Musical Review

In high spirits despite the inclement weather the 57 piece Cisco High School Lobo Band left early this morning in two chartered busses for San Antonio where they will participate in the band contests held in connection with the annual Battle of Flowers Festival now in progress. The judges will check each of the 40 participating bands for precision, rank files, diagonals and overall conduct, according to the association's specifications. Last year, led by Miss Frances Halstead drum major, the Cisco band took first place honors and the year before, won second place. Since the Battle of Flowers is restricted only to the most outstanding bands over Texas, steady work has enabled the Cisco band to attend the colorful event for the third consecutive year. And each year, the band has returned to Cisco highly rated by the judging committee. After tonight's combined gathering, the bands will have all day Thursday to tour the historic city's Brackenridge Park and zoo, the memorial grounds and the city itself. Early Friday afternoon, the Texas high school groups will take up formations for the Battle of the Flowers Grand Finale, a parade estimated to stretch over a distance of five miles. The procession will cut through downtown San Antonio and will wind up at the Alamo Stadium. During the entire three day festival, the bands will be quartered at Fort Sam Houston. The Cisco delegation, as well as the other participants, will leave San Antonio Saturday morning for their respective homes. The Ciscoans were expected to arrive here Saturday evening, it was stated. The trip to San Antonio was made possible through contributions by Cisco businessmen. Mrs. R. R. Jones and Mrs. J. R. Deen, representatives of the Band Parents' Association, accompanied the group. Fred Baumgardner is director.

Farm Official To Be Here Thursday And Friday To Register Area Farms

Emmett Powell, administrative officer of the Eastland County ACA, announced Wednesday that he and his staff would be at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce Thursday and Friday to register all farms in communities H and I for future subsidies and supports. He stressed the importance of registering under the program and made the following statement: "In order to maintain price supports and production figures on the various crops the government is now asking for the acreage of all crops grown on every farm in the county for the years 1945 through 1948. These figures must be obtained for every farm in the county. It is very necessary that you submit the correct information on your farm as requested or it may delay or make you ineligible to participate in future price support programs on cotton, wheat, grain sorghums and other farm crops." "This is the farmers' program and your co-operation will help you and the other farmers in Eastland County. In order to save time and driving, members of the AAA Office will bring the forms to your community centers for the sign-up programs. Each farmer will be notified in the next few days where their community meeting will be held." The following schedule will be followed: City Hall — Ranger, Texas — April 25-26, 1949 — community "B." Gorman High School Gymnasium — Gorman, Texas — April 27-28-29, 1949 — communities C and D. Desdemona High School Gymnasium, — Desdemona, Texas — May 2-3, 1949 — community "A." City Hall — Rising Star, Texas — May 4-5-6, 1949 — communities J-K-M and N. Carbon High School Gymnasium — Carbon, Texas — May 9-10 — community "G." Eastland Civic Worker Dies At Home Sunday

Funeral services for Curt Hertig, 63, secretary of the Eastland school board and Rotary Club, who died suddenly of a heart attack Sunday afternoon were held Tuesday at 2 o'clock in the First Methodist Church there. Interment was in the Eastland Cemetery, with Hammer Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. Hertig was found dead by a neighbor, Earl Conner, Jr., Eastland Attorney, after Carl Angstadt had telephoned him to investigate why Hertig had failed to keep a luncheon appointment. Justice of the Peace E. E. Wood returned a verdict of death by natural causes. According to information received here, physicians had ordered Hertig to bed for a rest and he had only recently resumed his his secretarial duties. Mrs. Hertig, who was in El Paso at the bedside of her brother, A. K. Powell, seriously ill, was notified of her husband's death and returned to Eastland Monday. A native of Fort Worth, Hertig moved to Eastland in 1925, to be employed by the Eastland Gas Co. For the past several years, he had held the secretaryship of the school board and the Rotary Club. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Margaret Hertig, and other relatives. The couple had no children.

Local National Guard Unit Plans Field Maneuvers To Be Held In May

Plans were completed this week to employ two sections of the Cisco National Guard unit, the 846th Armored Division, to Camp Barkley at Abilene May 21 and 22 in a series of preliminary rifle range drills. About 17 men will make up the two sections. On May 28-29, two more sections, composed of an equal number of men will be dispatched to the former war time training camp for firing practice. Sgt. Frank Schlepfer, administrative assistant, stated. Both sections will be issued small side arms and carbine light weight rifles during the bivouac at Camp Barkley. Large Crowd Attends Annual Scout Court Of Honor Ceremony Monday

Some 200 scouts and leaders crowded into the District Court room of the Eastland County courthouse Monday evening for the first annual district wide Comanche Trail Council Court of Honor held since before the war. Scout runners, holding flaming torches, light the still larger torches which bedecked the corner of the Eastland square. The torch lighting ceremony officially was the acceptance and pledge of each unit's part in the National "Strengthening the Arm of Liberty" program now in effect over the country. Members of the Cub Scout units, scouts and senior scouts participated in the ceremony. Following the Torch Ceremony, the group moved to the District Court room where Scout Field Executive Steve Fotts of Eastland presided over the issuing of scout awards. He was assisted by the district scout chairman. Approximately 171 gold medals were presented by the council. Ten Cisco scouts were among the group to receive advancement awards. They are as follows: Second class rank was awarded to Bob Benny, Bill Benny, Carroll Donohe, Jimmie Kleiner and Freddie Hayes; first class award to Harry Warren; Star rank awarded to Fred Smith and Vandell Weathers; Life award to Philip Porter, Bill Mitchum, Eagle Scout, received the Bronze Palm. The entire Cisco delegation was from Troop 101, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church. Charles Graham is scoutmaster. In addition to the awards, 26 merit badges were divided between four Cisco scouts. They were Vandell Weathers, who received 12; Freddy Smith, who received 10; Bill Mitchum, who received one, and Philip Porter, who received three.

Grain And Grass Benefitted By Soaking Rains

Farmers and ranchers over a wide area in every direction from Cisco were rejoicing today over heavy rains which brought promise of bumper grain crops and good grass lands and filled stock tanks to the brim. Rain had begun falling early Tuesday as Cisco measured a little over two inches at noon Wednesday and overcast skies gave promise of additional showers. The rain also renewed hopes in cities where water supplies

had dwindled. The catch in Lake Cisco measured several inches, and earthen tanks in the watershed were full and rain in the near future will pour into the lake. The value of the rain was lessened somewhat by storms, hail and floods in some areas, but the economic benefits were far more than the losses incurred. In the Brownwood area, five inches of rain fell, some residents were forced to flee from their homes to higher ground. The damage was greatest in north part of the city where Adam's Branch was out of banks. The North Concho in San Angelo was reported on a 19 foot rise while the Llano was up seven feet. Three Abilene lakes caught an estimated 650 million gallons of water. Hail the size of teacups fell in and around San Angelo and in the Del Rio area, inflicting heavy damage to growing crops and roofs. Wind in the Plains area caused some damage to farm houses but the rain assured farmers of good grain crops. Rain reports in this area were as follows: Eastland, 2 inches; Rising Star, 1.5 inches; Albany, one inch; Moran, Two inches; Anson, 1.32; Stamford, 2.07; Coleman, 2.0; Brownwood, 3.0; Abilene, 1.77; Big Spring, 1.71; and Snyder, 3.50.

Boy Scout Camp Dates Set

Camp Billy Gibbons, the Comanche Trail Council's Camp, will run for three weeks this summer. The dates are: June 24th to July 1st, July 1st to 7th, July 7th to the 15th. The Camp is located on Brady Creek, some four and one half miles from where Brady Creek empties into the San Saba River in San Saba County. This will be the third summer for the new Camp to be held. Several improvements are being made before the Camp opens and according to Scout officials, one of the best Camp Staffs will be in charge of the various phases of the Camp program. Angling will be one of the features of the Camp, and should be good, since the Creek has been stocked for the past two years. Questionnaires are being sent out from the Central Office to Unit Leaders, asking which week they prefer to come with their troop. The Camp will be dedicated July 3.

Veteran Trainees Need Certificate Of Eligibility

Veterans who are planning to resume interrupted education and training under the GI Bill should wait until they get their supplemental certificate of eligibility before they go back to school or on-the-job training. The local Veterans Administration Office has announced. "The recent change in number of veterans who have gone back to school or on-the-job training without waiting to get their supplemental certificates from the VA, prompted the VA's warning. Until the certificates are issued, the VA is not obligated to pay for tuition, subsistence allowance, or other expenses. Collection, under these circumstances, is strictly up to the school and the veteran, the VA said. The VA has repeatedly informed veterans that 30 days is the minimum time in which to apply for a supplemental certificate. The place to get it is at your nearest VA regional office. So, veterans, if you've interrupted your education or on-the-job training and are planning to go back to school or in training be sure to apply for your supplemental certificate 30 days in advance. That way, you'll avoid any difficult about government payment for your tuition, expenses.

Drug Is Found That Prevents Coccidiosis

A new drug has been found that will prevent coccidiosis in

poultry. It will not cure the disease after the chicken already has it, but it will prevent the disease from getting in your flock if you feed it all the time.

The drug is sulfaquinoxaline. Two ounces of the sulfaquinoxaline per each 1000 pounds of feed will be sufficient to stop the dreaded coccidiosis. Too much of the drug will cause no harmful effects on the poultry.

The price on the preventative is around \$15.00 per pound, so it is a very cheap way to keep a flock of chickens coccidiosis clean.

Oil Development Is On The Up-Grade In Callahan County With Prospects Of Several New Wells In The Near Future

The Dancinger Oil Company of Dallas and others are surveying and leasing acreage southeast of Putnam in the Scranton - Zion Hill area with view of putting down a deep test in that area as soon as the preliminary work can be completed. This company has offered to lease some land on the Cross Plains and Putnam highway about three miles south of Putnam. It has been reported some acreage has been leased for as much as \$5 per acre. There has been no location yet.

Two and one half miles northeast of Cross Plains, Paul C. Lawles of Abilene, has completed his No. 1, C. D. Westerman, south extension to Ranger lime production, 330 feet from the north line and 1355 from the east line of R. M. Pucket survey. Official gauge showed the well making 90 barrels of 40 gravity oil in 24 hours on pump from open hole at 3,235 - 3,318 feet.

The department advisor said it wasn't difficult to anticipate what "her girls" will do after graduation.

From past cases, Mrs. Bradshaw showed, a large percentage of the girls will get married and then apply the fundamentals they have learned while in school. Then others will enter the hundreds of professional fields of home economics, as mentioned. The remaining will enter college to continue the course of home economics and then become teachers.

In addition to the prescribed study, the high school department has fostered a movement called the Future Homemakers of America, a national organization that tends to unite state groups interested in and working towards better home life, sponsors projects and increases opportunities for the development of leadership, so much in need in a democratic society.

After a tour of the department, Mrs. Bradshaw has every reason to be proud of the high rating her class has attained during the number of years home economics has been a part of the system.

At the disposal of the girl economists is a spacious kitchen equipped with the most modern in oven ranges, refrigerators, cooking utensils and plate ware, not to mention the beauty of the adjoining dining room, where the girls practice table setting and artistic decorations.

Passing from the kitchen, through the director's private office, one can sense the livable and comfortable atmosphere of the sewing and clothing room. Here, the girls have access to

eight sewing machines, manual training and makeup tables for pattern experiments.

"Homemaking touches every part of home management and upkeep," Mrs. Bradshaw was quoted. "Not only do they learn to cook and sew but they are shown why certain methods, such as budget and close co-operation, are essential."

"By doing, the girls learn," she concluded.

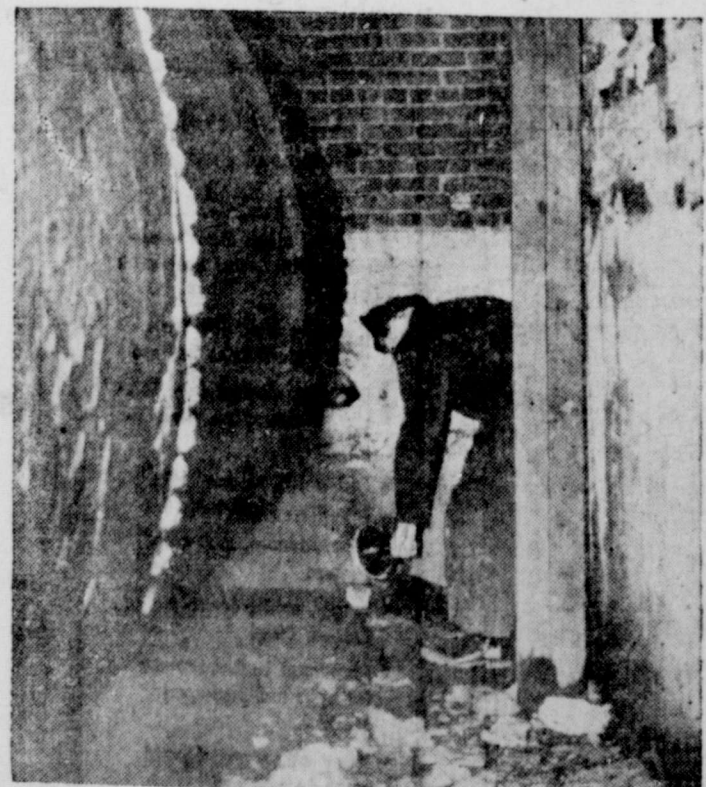
