

# **Mercury Drops To** 54; 1.2 Inches **Rain Falls Here**

The earliest fall cold spell in more than 30 years struck the area early Tuesday morning and tumbled the temperature from a high of 97 Monday to a high of 66 Tuesday. Early Wednesday morning the mercury stood at 54 degrees to register the lowest mark since March Cool air moving in from Can ada met warm air from the Gulf of Mexico and caused genera rains over the area. In Cisco the gauges showed that 1.2 inches of rain fell Tuesday night and Wednesday morning ad the weatherman promised additional showers for Wednesday night and Thursday.

A gradual warming up of the entire state was forecast for the remainder of the week but observers felt that hot weather was over for the year and pre dicted an early winter.

The rain was beneficial to peauts and fall grains as well as late gardens. Cotton growers reported that the rain fell so slowly that little damage to open bolls was evident. The harvest was underway in most sections Only a few inches of water was caught in Lake Cisco due to the
