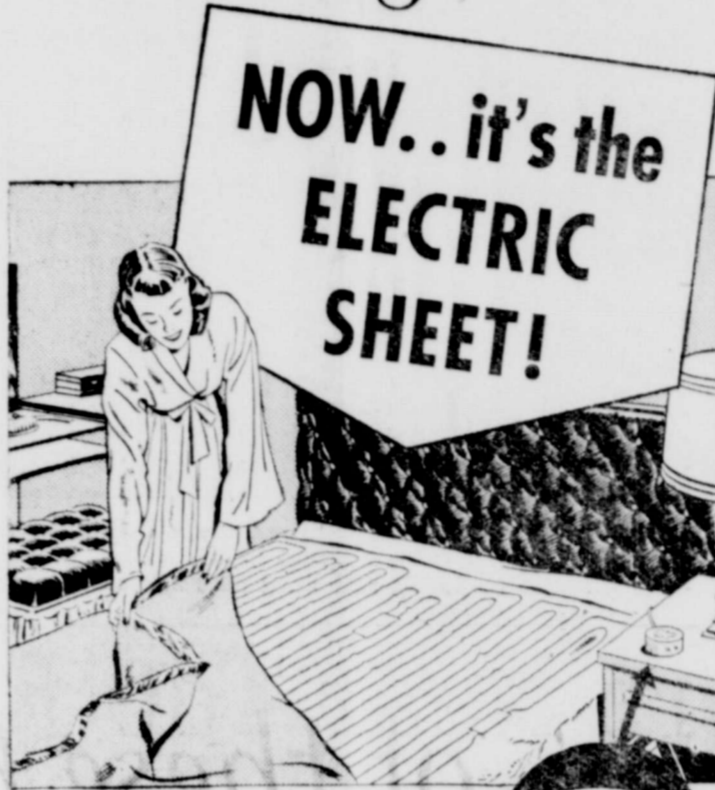
Circle Two Meets Tuesday For Lunch And Program
