The \$3,000 limitation on wages Abilene office of the Social Security Administration.

The fact that the social security tax advanced from 1% to 11/2% has caused some employers to inquire if the law has been changed to tax more than the first \$3,000 in wages paid to an employee in a year.

"The law that limits taxable wages to the first \$3,000 in wages paid by an employer to each employee is still in effect," said Fisher, "and only an Act of Congress will change the law pertaining to the maximum wages to be this area of Texas, consisting of taxed."
