AUSTIN, Feb. 11—Fifty-seven new businesses operated by the blind under state supervision in Texas have been set up with ten more on their way by the end of the coming summer. That was the report Saturday of Lon Alsop, executive secretary-director of the State Commission for the blind, who said most of the firms are concession stands in federal, state, and municipal buildings.

He reported 111 blind persons were placed in gainful employment in the last six months of 1933. The agency expects to place at least 100 by June 30.
