Gains In Members Made By Church

NASHVILLE, TENN., May 6—The Dallas-Ft. Worth Episcopal Area of The Methodist Church reported a church school membership of 205,883 for 1949, it has been revealed by the annual statistical report of the Department of General Church School Work of the Methodist General Board of Education.

If this number of persons should join hands they would form a line that would reach from Dallas to Shreveport, it was said by the Rev. Walter Townner, director of the Department.

This was the second largest total reported by any of the six episcopal areas of the denomination's South Central Jurisdiction, the Kansas-Nebraska Area having reported 218,655.

Methodist church school membership of the area gained 6,225 while Methodist church school membership for the whole nation is reported as totaling 5,779,823 for 1949, a gain of over a million in the past five years.

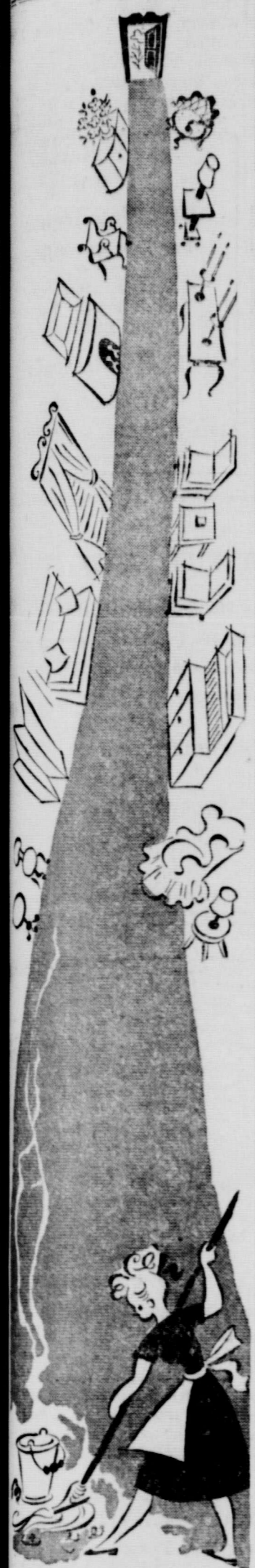
