Of Big Potential Possible In Plan

000 to \$7,000 is available to the poultrymen of the Cisco area through the production of top quality eggs speckers at a Chamber of Commerce egg production and marketing school pointed out here Friday afternoon.

F. M. Stockton, assistant poultry and marketing specialist of Texas A. & M. college, was in charge of the school , which was held on the roof garden of the Victor Hctel. He was assisted by County Agent J. M. Cooper, with Manager B. A. Butler of the Chamber of Commerce in charge of arrangements.

Pointing out that only 24 counties in Texas are producing Grade "A", Stockton said that top quality eggs are worth from \$2 to \$3.50 per case more than ordirary eggs. He said that Texas row produces more eggs than the state consumer, yet imports many carloads each year from Wisconsin and other northern states. The imported eggs are of the top grade.

ockton gave background infor action on the work of other communities in egg production. At Dublin, top eggs are produced and purchased by a large grocery chain. A similiar setup is working well in the Houston area. He covered methods of handling, storing, gathering, packing and selecting eggs for the nurket.


