kind of thinking a habit has kind of thinking a habit has gotten awfully close to real
religion. Such a way of thinking is closely akin to being raised from spiritual death.
I would hold my own Special Olympics and have every child perform with the total emphasis being on how much they
have improved from where they started. I would have degree achievement program similar to the belts you can earn in karate. These would be based on how well the child did
with what he had to begin with and not how well h with what he had to begin with and not how well he
outperformed the others. This would teach the children that "keeping up with the Joneses" is a false way to life. the process help the other fellow achieve his best also. Along
with this whatever concepts of God the children had would hopefully be implanted with the idea that God is fair and judges us according to what we do with what he gives us and never by the standard of whatever someone else has done with is a vital part of real religion.
