Proper Planting Keeps Sand From Blowing On Farm

Can you imagine a deep sandy field which isn't blowing now, on our worst windy days? It can happen here, according to L. R. Higginbottom, supervisor of the 7 5 14 19 Upper Leon Soil Conservation

> All through the last few months of extreme drouth, one of Mr.

What has made the difference? Mr. Higginbottom's field was strip-cropped with 8 rows of peanuts, and 2 of sudan. The sudan was planted with corn plate, so that it came up thick bunches. Planted this way, it made a wind-break, which will remain

standing all winter. But this is not all! He harvested about \$200, worth of sudan seed from the four acres in the strips, he says. By setting the combine high, he left the stalks standing, to do their job this winter.

"Cover crops are wonderful," said Mr. Higginbottom, "but we need good strip crops, as part of a complete conservation pro-


