

Gasoline Plant Opens Offices In Rising Star

W. J. Snakard, trustee for the newly formed Padre Oil Co., has opened the headquarters which will serve as offices for the company, in the Dunn Building in Rising Star and will look after operations on the lease and at

the plant from this central office. Miss Hazel Holcomb, of Kansas City, is in charge of the office, it was reported.

M. H. Kelley, engineer in charge of the construction and installation work at the Casinghead plant being put in by the company on the A. O. Angel farm eight miles south of Rising Star, is beginning preliminary work on the project.

Mr. Snakard recently reported that the firm hoped to have the plant in operation about the middle of March barring a lot of bad weather. In addition to casinghead gasoline the plant is to produce propane and butane gas and also butyl from which synthetic rubber is made.



Two More Units Are Planned For Negro Occupancy

of 50 housing units in Cisco is expected to be formerlly signed between the city housing authority and the Lambert and Son Construction Company of Abilene early this week, it was reported Saturday. The Lambert company was low bidder recently for the contract with a bid of about \$351,000.

Considerable detail work has been completed and the housing authority is due to meet early this week to approve a budget for the project and authorize the signing of the contract. The Lambert company has indicated that it is ready to commence work as soon as the contract is former-

In addition to the 50 housing units, the authority will negotiate another contract with Lambert for the erection of two additional units to be built for colored occupancy. The two units will be built near the Negro school.

Roy C. Males, Dallas civil engineer, will be sent to Cisco to be the authority's supervising engineer. Males also will supervise housing unit contruction at Ranger and Dublin from his Cis-
