You're Almost Indestructible

Despite the scare stories that find such wide circulation, the ordinary man is a tough, self-repairing machine made to stand up wonderfully under the bludgeonings of time. Every breath brings more than 125,000,000 dust particles and an enormous quantity of germs into a man's body, but it's highly unlikely that any of them will do any damage: the average man is built to take the gaff.

The body's defenses against disease and injury are thoroughly explored by Pageant magazine in an article "You're Tough to Kill," by Lawrence Galton. The author examines some nearly incredible cases of human resistance: the middle-aged bum in New York who had to be crushed by a truck after prolonged exposure to frost, food poisoning, and a planned automobile accident left him relatively unharmed; and the Bostonian who lived an active and un-doctored life despite extensive

tuberculosis of both lungs, cirrhosis of the liver, a disease that had destroyed parts of both kidneys, and serious hardening of the arteries.

What's even more remarkable, points out Pageant, is the way the body resists its owner's attempts to injure it. Overwork and worry, weekend exercise by the sedentary, diets, fads and self-doctoring would all seem capable of killing a man — but many men

indulge in all and emerge without a scratch. The human body is impossibly tough. The shin bone can support a weight of almost two tons, a single square inch of muscle can lift 140 pounds of dead weight, a skull, though, it seems inflexible, can be shrunk ten percent before it cracks. Moreover, says Pageant, the body is self-sustaining; investigations at the Univer-

sity of Pennsylvania have shown that after surgery has removed three-quarters of the liver, the body will replace 85 percent of it within two weeks. The miracle of life is not that people live through damaging diseases, but that they die at all!

WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS

"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Acts 16:30)
Mark 16:16 is one of the many scriptural answers to the above questions. At the same time it completely refutes the modern denominational teachings of the question, and on Mark 16:16 as well. They would have you to believe it reads thusly: "He that believeth, is saved, and may be baptized if he so desires." There is not one syllable of truth in any such doctrine. Before we study some various translations of this particular verse of the New Testament, let us give the familiar King James Version's rendition: "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned." (Mk. 16:16)

Charles B. Williams' Translation-Endorsed by J. R. Mantey of the Northern Baptist Theological Seminary. "He who believes it (gospel) and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe it will be condemned."

American Bible Union Version-Published By The American Baptist Publication Society. (Edition with Immersion) "He that believes and is immersed shall be saved, but he that disbelieves shall be condemned."

John Wesley's Translation. "He that believeth and is baptized, shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be condemned." Now let us note from the Methodist Discipline - "Justification by faith only is a most wholesome doctrine and very full of comfort." Is it not a fact that if Mr. Wesley was correct, then does it not follow that they who adhere to the discipline are in error? Mr. Wesley was the founder of the Methodist Church (Wesley's works, Vol. 7, p. 346.)

Challoner-Rheims-Confraternity Roman Catholic Version. "He who believes and is baptized shall be saved, but he who does not believe shall be condemned."

The Emphatic Diaglott- (1) Interlinear (2) New Version. (1) Interlinear-"He having believed and having been dipped, shall be saved; but he not having believed, shall be condemned." (2) New Version-"He who believes and is immersed will be saved; but he who believes not, shall be condemned." In conclusion, may we suggest to you that when someone says that "You believe and receive salvation, and may then be baptized if you like," ask them to harmonize such with Gods eternal Word.
