BACKGROUND MEMO ON RETAIL MARGIN CONTROL REGULATION By LUCILE HUFFMYER, Sec'y MERCHANTS CREDIT ASSOCIATION

This regulation is the first of a series designed to replace the Ge eral Ceiling price Regulation, the freeze order of January 26, 1951 with an effective price control system for stabilizing the economy

In brief, this regulation locks up and freezes the margins of re tailers on broad categories of consumer soft and durable goods, reprices to those existing on the list date and with a provision for perivailing during the very competitive periods before Korea.
