lawful for any person, partnership, association of persons, or any orporation to drill or commence drill a well for oil or gas within the City Limits, or to work upon or assist in any way in the prosecution of any such well, or to produce oil and/or gas from a well within the City limits without a permit for the drilling of aid well and production of oil thorized to announce candidates first been issued by the authority and/or gas the reform having of the governing body of the City in accordance with the terms of

> SECTIONS 2 thru 21 inclusive pertain to the method of securing the permit and the regulatory powers of the City of Cisco Comnission or its agents.

> SECTION 22: That any violation of any of the terms of this ordinance, whether herein dominated as unlawful or not, shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and any person or corporation convicted of any such violation shall be fined in a sum not exceeding \$200.00 Dollars, and any person so convicted shall be committed to jail until such fine and the costs are paid. Each day of the connance of such violation shall be considered a separate offense and be punishable separately, and any person, agent or employee engaged in any such violation shall on conviction so be unished therefor



Spade Your Own Garden This Muscle Saving Way



condition to spade. Never work soil which is too wet; and if the soil is heavy, don't wait until it has become too dry. There is a point between extremes when even heavy clay can easily be lifted, and will crumble under a blow from the spade. You can tell this point by using the "mud pie" test.

Mould a ball of earth in your hand, and pat it to make a mud pie. If the ple holds together, the soil is too wet to spade. If it crumbles, then you can go ahead.

Systematic spading makes the job easier, and more complete. Here is one way to do it: Set a definite task for your first day's work, say a strip six feet wide, running the shortest dimension of the garden. At one end dig a ditch, say one foot wide and the depth of the spade, removing all soil from it.




Pile this soil near the opposite end

Now begin to spade with the lade not parallel to the trench, The spade should be driven down, not on a slant, but perpendicularly
