THE USE OF bunnies and eggs to celebrate Easter is one of mankind's most ancient holiday customs, according to a bit of research. It is remarkable how ancient peoples — often far removed from each other — decided that the egg was the symbol to indicate the beginning of life. The Gauls, Persians, Greeks, Romans, and Jews are but a few of those who believed the egg to hold the mystery of life.

As a time of feasting and celebration, Easter goes back to antiquity. Many believe that it was started by the first celebration of the vernal equinox, which was the birth of spring and the original New Year's Day. The Persians celebrated the new year with a "feast of the eggs," and the Jews used colored eggs to celebrate their Passover, which is held on the first full moon of spring.

The Christians borrowed the egg, gave it a slightly different meaning, and colored it red. To the early Christians, the egg was regarded in the light of a prison from which new life escaped. The color red was used to denote the blood of Christ.

The Easter rabbit is a survivor of an ancient Egyptian custom. Because hares were born with both eyes open, they were sacred to the "open-eyed" moon. As Easter of the ancient New Year was associated with the moon's orbit, the hare was a natural symbol.

Easter got its name from Eostre the goddess of life and spring. The idea of rabbits laying Easter eggs is believed to be a later German innovation. The Americans made the ancient hare into an Easter Bunny and the candy makers now lay most of the eggs.

And Easter, you know, falls each year on the first Sunday after the first Monday after the vernal equinox.

Natural Gas Has Plenty For Needs Of Defense Work

AMARILLO, March 22.—Defense fuel requirements of the nation can consume all the natural gas they need without fear of sending users begging for some other less satisfactory fuel when peace comes, in the opinion of Paul Kayser, president of El Paso Natural Gas Company.

The El Paso and Houston gas executive was a principal speaker at the Thursday session of the American Petroleum Institute Division of Production, which closes a three-day Mid-Continent district meeting here Friday.

In his 25-minute address, Kayser dwelt heavily on the natural gas industry's right to expand and market its product during the national emergency, pointing out that the manufacture of synthetic fuels could simply be tied-in to the enlarged production and transportation system when the natural gas became exhausted — if that time ever actually should come.

Kayser said that the past five-year period has been the time of greatest expansion in the natural gas business. "Despite the phenomenal increase in the use of this commodity," he commented, "the known reserves have increased more than 25 trillion cubic feet."

Pointing to production of war-and-peace materials like copper, potash, aluminum and steel, the gas company president stated that natural gas qualified as an essential commodity in terms of both a defense and peacetime economy.

The API meeting ends Friday night with a banquet.

American boys entering employment at age 18 have 66 chances in 100 of living to the retirement age of 65. For their grandfathers who started work around the turn of the century the chances of attaining age 65 were only 51 in 100.

This is based upon a study by insurance company statisticians of the improvement since 1900 in the chances of attaining age 65. During the first half of the 20th century the expectation of life at birth in the United States has increased from 49 to 68 years.

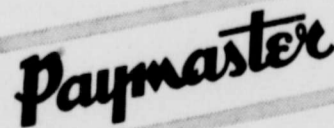
