Mr. McNatt cautioned that those persons who became eligible on September 1, 1950, because the amendments to the Social Security Act should apply by March 31, 1951, in order to avoid losing payments. This is because retro active payments can be made for not more than six months.

Persons who should apply now include workers over the age of 65 who have had at least a year and a half of work under Social Security; children or other dependent survivors of World War II veterans, who are now given Social Security credits for military services; and workers over the age they are still employed.
