National Model Airplane Meet To Be Held July 23

DALLAS, April 10—The 20th Annual National Model Airplane championship meet will be held at the Naval Air Station here during the week of July 23.

It will be the second straight year for the meet to be held here and the fourth consecutive time for the Navy to play host to the model airman.

Officially sanctioned by the Academy of Model Aeronautics and sponsored by the National Exchange Club, the meet will have two Navy events.

In one, model airplanes will take off and land on a simulated carrier deck under their own power. The other event will send radio-controlled models to drop bombs on a small target.

All events are staged according to age groups. In last year's meet the youngest contestant was five years old.

The Navy is expecting more than 100,000 model enthusiasts to attend the finals this year. A workshop and hangar facilities for the model airplane builders will be provided. The Navy said it also will furnish living quarters and meals at a nominal cost.
