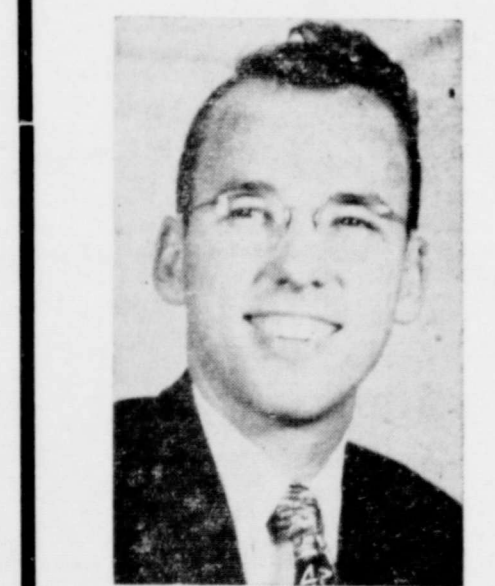

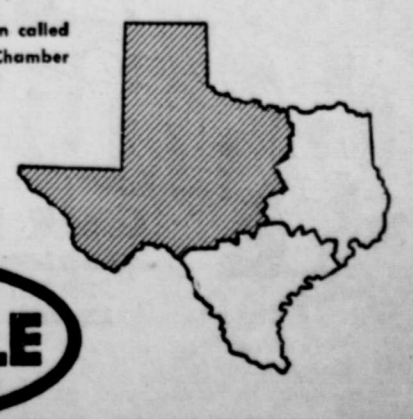

Bridges carried the ball down to the 25. Cameron got loose for eight more and picked up a first on the next play. A 15 yard penalty set the Rams back to the 28. Bridges picked up seven and Armstrong hit Frederick in the end zone for a touchdown. San Angelo failed to convert.

Cisco received the ball on her own 40. After two incomplete passes and a 13 yard loss, Cham-

bers attempted a punt. It was blocked and covered on the 38. Cisco held for downs. Moore hit Darr on the Ram 41. Williams intercepted a pass on his own 26. 
