Several Projects Are Planned Here

A Caddo lime oil discovery well for the area near Pueblo, 10 miles northwest of Cisco in the edge of Callahan County, was reported here today. The new producer is the McElroy Ranch Company No. 1-B E. W. McCollum, located in Section 3199, TE & L Survey. Reports showed that the well flowed 13 barrels of 43 gravity oil during a potential test. Flow was through a 15-16 choke with 950 pounds on the casing and 750 pounds on the tubing. Production from casing perforations at 3,256 feet. A new project for the Cisco area was the Jack-Hailey No. 1 Thelma H. Richardson et al to be an offset to the Carey well in South Cisco. The 4,000 foot rotary test will be located 849 feet from the north and 960 feet from the west lines of Section 66, Block 3, H&TC Survey. Another new project planned is the Wilcox Investment Co. No. 1 T. T. Horn, six miles southwest of Cisco. Location is 330 feet from the north and east lines of Section 108, Block 3, H&TC Survey. A new project for the Bankline-Owens area, five miles northeast of Cisco, will be the J. K. Wadley and Hilton et al No. 1 Mrs. Bernice McGough. Location is 1,927 feet from the west and 2,368 feet from the south lines of Section 42, Block 4, H&TC Survey. Permit calls for 4,000 feet. Bankline Oil Company's No. 3 C. E. Reynolds has set pipe after topping the Lake Sand at 3,382 feet. In the same area, Cooper-Hemphill No. 3-B J. S. Hart was testing in completion work. South of Cisco, the E. C. Connally No. 1 A. Z. Myrick was testing during Lake sand completion work. Initial flow indicated that the well would make more than 20 barrels per day with a high gas-oil ratio. Six miles southwest of Cisco, Wilcox Investment Company No. 1 Leverage Estate set pipe last week at 2,286 feet in the Strawn sand. It was due to begin completion work Wednesday.

Young Cisco Man Dies Of Injuries In Auto Accident

Funeral services for Marvin T. (Buddy) Harris, 30, of Cisco will be held at 2 p. m. Wednesday in Breckenridge. Mr. Harris died at 1:30 p. m. Monday in a Breckenridge hospital of injuries received in an automobile accident Saturday night near Breckenridge. Harris was born in Cisco and had lived here all his life. He attended grade and high school here. He was a World War II veteran having served in the armed forces for more than three years. The accident occurred about two and a half miles from Breckenridge on the Cisco-Breckenridge highway. Harris' car turned over when he lost control after hitting a soft shoulder. Best Bulls Are Available To All In Area Program

Dairy cows bred now will freshen the latter part of next August and be in production all next fall and winter, says Clyde Hickson, Cisco, artificial breeding technician for the Eastland County Dairy Association, sponsoring organization.

For a very reasonable fee dairy cow owners in the county or within 30 miles of Cisco can breed their animals to some of the best bulls in the country, it was said. Besides Jerseys, there are also bulls of the Holstein, Guernsey and Shorthorn breeds available.

More than 1,500 cows in this area have been artificially bred since the program was instituted by the dairy association in the early part of February of 1949, according to A. Z. Myrick, Cisco, president of the group.

The North Texas Artificial Breeding Farms near Dallas, who cooperate in the breeding program, keep the very best bulls obtainable. Some of their bulls are imported animals. One of their Guernsey bulls was only recently imported from the Guernsey Islands where the breed originated.

### Civil Service To Hold Job Exams

The United States Civil Service Commission today announced an examination for filling cartographic aid positions at salaries ranging from \$2,500 to \$8,360 a year, and for cartographic draftsman positions paying from \$2,500 to \$4,205 a year. For cartographic draftsman positions, applicants must submit with their application a sample of their work.
