April weather, dry & boring

Local official weather guy John Gurley could have written April's weather on the back of a business card. Once again the city received virtually no rain (.39 inch) lots of wind (peak at 55 mph), and a scattering of small hail April 24.

The average high temperature was 72, average low 37. The highest recorded temperature was 87 on April 16. The lowest recorded was 27 April 19. Winds blew most of the month, with the 55+ mph recorded on April 11.

Cemetery clean-up day will be May 15

The Friona Cemetery Association urges everyone to come out and beautify the cemetery for Memorial Day.

A cemetery spokesperson said, "Every lot needs attention but most of the clean-up is from trash and weeds that have blown in with recent windy weather."

The clean-up day is Thursday May 15. Volunteer workers should be there at 5 p.m. Trash bags will be furnished and dumpsters will be available. Bring your weedeaters, clippers, hoes, and rakes and pitch in to help.

KidFish Sunday at Reeve Lake

The east half of Reeve Lake will once again be stocked with catfish in anticipation of the annual Kid Fish event

Sunday, May 11, from 1-4 p.m. Small-fry fishermen will need to register at the community center prior to the Kid Fish in order to be eligible for prize drawings. Kids will be grouped by age. Rods and reels and bait will be furnished. All kids are required to be accompanied by an adult.

Rabies vaccination clinic on May 15

The Friona City Code requires annual animal registration and vaccination for dogs and cats.

The City of Friona and Friona Veterinary Clinic will hold a rabies vaccination clinic at the Friona Community Center on Thursday May 15 from 4-6 p.m.

All dogs and cats in the city limits must have a city tag and rabies vaccination. Cost for the rabies shot and tag will be \$10. Also available will be Distemper/Parvo shots for dogs and 4-Way Feline shots for cats. These are an additional \$10 each.

Animals must be restrained by a leash. Guard dogs must be securely muzzled and leashed.



Steak with a caffeine kick?

going to toss it all together later on? Maybe you could BY RON CARR

Leave the grill cover on. Let's get ready to broil.

Stole this information out of the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal Wednesday April 30 edition. They said this marinade imparts subtle savory, almost creamy notes to the steak. The acid in the coffee helps tenderize the meat.

This should be a great use for that leftover morning coffee. They suggested coffee marinated sirloin but it should work on any meat you normally marinate and broil. Cold coffee, red pepper, and peanut butter. Why didn't I think of that.

Coffee Marinated Sirloin

Start to finish: 1 1/2 hours

Servings: 4

1 1/2 cups cold coffee 1/4 tsp red pepper flakes

½ cup peanut butter

2 tbsp honey

1/2 inch chunk fresh ginger salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

Four 8-ounce bottom sirloin steaks (or other broiler friendly cuts)

2 tbsp canola or vegetable oil


In a blender or food processor combine the coffee, pepper flakes, peanut butter, honey, and ginger. Puree until smooth, then taste and season with salt and pepper.

Pour half the marinade in a baking dish. Set the steaks in the dish then pour the remaining marinade over them. Cover and refrigerate for one hour. 1. In 3 ½ quart salad bowl or straight sided souffle

When ready to cook pre-heat the broiler. Line a rimmed dish layer salad as follows: bell pepper, onion, lettuce, baking sheet with foil. In a large deep skillet heat the oil over medium high. Add the steak, in batches if necessary, 2. Mix together the mayo, sour cream, and chipotle and sear until lightly browned, about 3-4 minutes per side. peppers. Spread over top of salad, cover, and refrigerate

Transfer the steaks to the prepared baking sheet. For medium rare, broil 7-8 minutes; or until an instant read thermometer inserted in the thickest part of the steak reads 135 degrees. Let the steaks rest for 10 minutes before serving.

One Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education unit in the general category will be offered to those with a private applicator's license.



My impatience with myself stands in stark contrast to God's patience. He has seen my nature, my ability, my potential, all of my life. His blows of the chisel are gentle and unhurried when compared to my frantic attempts to sculpt a better person. His fingers on the clay are filled with tender grace, compared to my clumsy attempts to remold.

Perhaps instead of being patient with myself, I need to simply release myself to this patient hand. Perhaps instead of my attempts to shape my life, I need to trust his creative finishing of his original work.





T. LEON TALLEY, Minister, Sixth Street Church of Christ It's interesting to notice that there are some very important passages in the Bible that speak to us about inspiration. Take II Timothy 3:16 for instance. "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

And there's II Peter 1:20-21, "Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. For prophecy never had it's origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God, as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." These passages teach three important things:

1.) God Reveals The Word of God has it's origin not in man's will but God's will. It is "God-breathed".

2.) Man Reports The Word of God was "spoken" by men as the spirit moved them, whether Old Testament prophets, apostles or inspired writers of the New Testament. Men were the conduits for God's Word. Not the source!

3.) Scripture Results When God "breathes" and man speaks, scripture is the result! The outcome of God speaking through man is the written Word. (More next article.)
