Over 7,000 Pay **Poll Tax Before** Jan. 31 Deadline

Cisco and Eastland County will have a near-record number of people eligible to take part in city, county, state and national elections during 1952 as a result of rushing business at poll tax payment stations this week.

Stanley Webb, Eastland County Tax Assessor and Collector, estimated that the county would have a total voting strength of approximately 7,500 persons for

Webb said "we literally sold out" of poll tax receipts. The ounty had forms to issue 6,800 poll taxes. And only one book was left that had any blank reeipts in it and that was at Ran-

Cisco's sub-station at the Chamber of Commerce was issued seven books of 150 receipts each. The last book was sold out Thursday afternoon, and more than 100 additional poll tax payments were accepted on order forms - the receipts to be mailed out at a later date.

Webb estimated that Cisco voers paid about 1,200 poll taxes it the Chamber of Commerce office. At Ranger, some 1,000 poll tax receipts were issued. Rising Star sold in excess of 450, and the Gorman sub-station sold about 450.

The courthouse office ran out of receipts early in the day Thursday. Old 1947 forms were then used, the date being changed. In addition to the 6,800 poll axes issued, the county will have several hundred persons eligible to vote by exemption. The exemptions apply to persons over 60 years of age and to those who become 21 years of age durng the calendar year.

Exemption certificates were not issued, however, because they are not required in cities under 10,000 population.




