

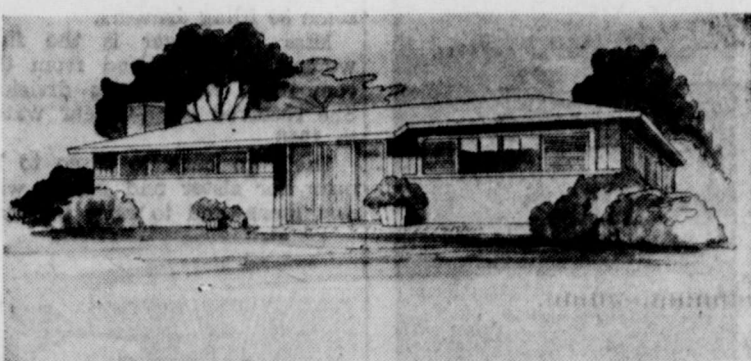

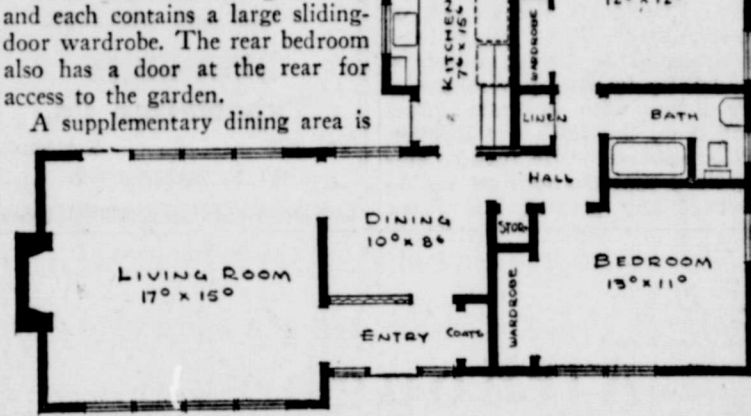
This unit is a happy combination of conventional and modern design. The use of the hipped roof avoids the extreme modern but the low pitch and the use of louvers and large panels of glass are in keeping with the more recent type or home planning. Unless the house is placed on the lot with the bedrooms to the front, it would be necessary to build on at least a sixty foot wide lot. The overall area of the unit is 1028 sq. ft.

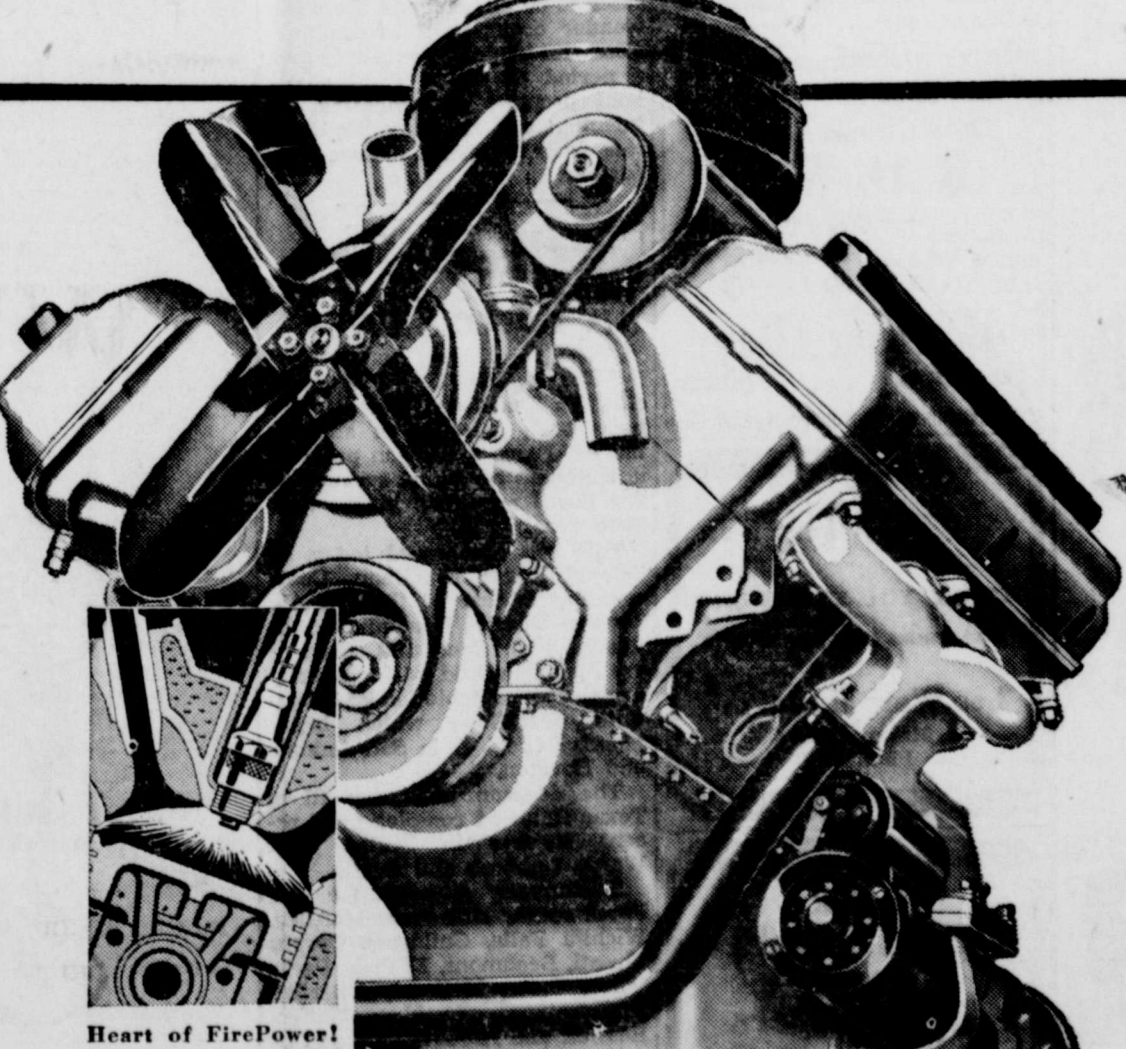
