School Week To Be Observed In Baird March 2-8

Representatives from nearly every club or group of people in Baird met Thursday, January 31, at the High School to discuss plans for Texas Public Schools Week from March 2-8.

This will be the second annual observance of Public Schools Week. The slogan this year is "Texas Public Schools—Democracy In Action." The purpose of this week is to acquaint the community with the public school.

At the regular meeting of the Callahan County Club Wednesday the need of a work program for community improvements was discussed at length and an invitation was extended to the West Texas Chamber of Commerce to send a specialist, Ralph Duncan, to a club meeting in the near future to explain how the work program under his direction is applied to other towns in West Texas compared to Baird.

One of the needs of Baird discussed was a cotton gin. The cotton gin was destroyed by fire last season. Ace Hickman stressed that with the outlook for a large acreage of cotton to be raised in this country this year much business would leave the county unless one can be obtained. Another need mentioned was a produce house that would provide a market for all farmers and to make Baird a better town.

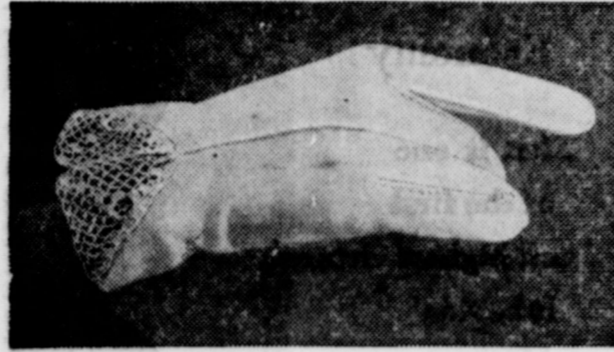

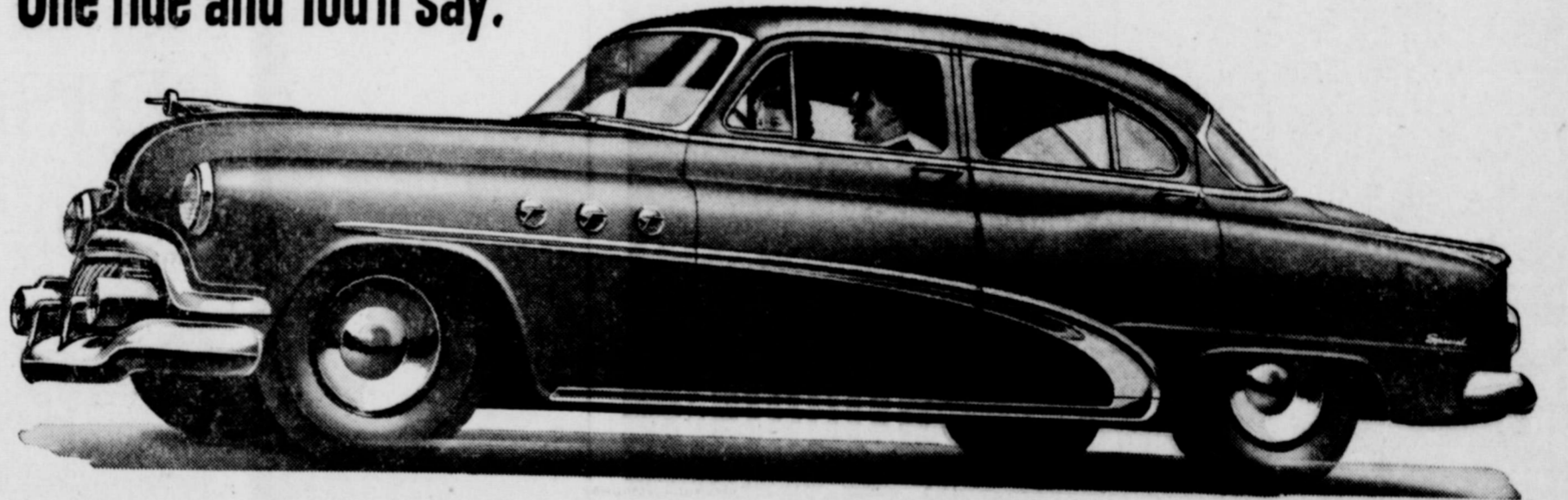

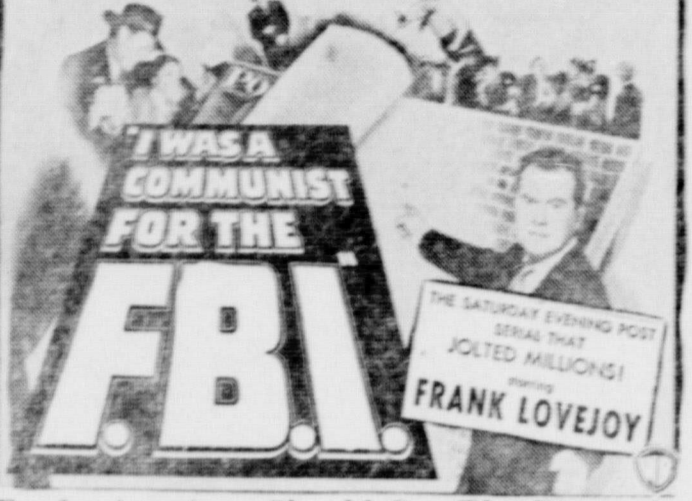
