In 303 A.D. the Roman Emperor Diocletian began one of the most terrible persecutions of Christianity in history. One target of his violence was the Bible itself. He ordered every copy of the Bible to be confiscated and burmed Only twenty-five years later the next Emperor, Emperor Constantine, ordered that fifty copies of scripture be
prepared and paid for by the Roman govermment. repared and paid for by the Roman govermmen.
In spite of Diocletian's efforss, there were plenty of Bibles around to make more copies.
Voltaire, the French deist who died in 1778, boasted that within 100 years of time the Bible would be nonexistent, replaced by his own work. It is reported that fifty years after his death the Geneva Bible Society bought a house and printing press of Voltaire's and printed stacks of Bibles in his living room.
Voltaire has become a historical footnote while the Bible continues to increase in every part of the world. Bemard Ramm, author of "Protestant Christian Evidences" said, "a thousand times over, the death knell of the Bible has been sounded, the funeral procession formed, the inscription cut on the tombstone and the committal read, but somehow the corpse never stays put. The Bible is still loved by millions, read by millions and studied by milions" (p. 232-233).

The district 10 -year average annual change increased
from -0.76 of a foot for the 2006 report to -0.82 of a foot for the current report. The district five-year average annual change decreased from -0.61 of a foot for the 2006 report to -0.46 of a foot for he current report.
An average annual increase in groundwater levels was re-
corded in the portions of Armstrong, Crosby, and Floyd Counties within the district, as well as Hockley, Lubbock, and Lynn Counties. The water level increases the portion of Crosby County within the district to 1.62 feet in Lynn County.
