SINCE LAKE CISCO is low they're using water from the third intake valve at this time The valve system is under the dam, and the treating and pumping plants are nearby. Water comes from the lake through the treating plant and a 16-inch pipe line to the 2,000,000 gallon storage tank on college hill.

Pumps at the lake keep the college hill reservoir full, and a pumping plant there distributes water over town.

AT LAKE CISCO, Mr. Arlin Agnew showed us through all of the plant. He has been with the city for a good many years and is a goodwill ambassador for the city as well as an operator of the pump station. Scores of visitors go through the dam each year and he answers their ques-


