HEALTH TALKS

The liver is the largest organ in the body, located on the upper right side of the abdomen, partly covered by the ribs. The name "liver" is significant because it must function to maintain life. Only a small part of it may function properly during some diseases but some part of the liver must keep carrying on its business or there cannot be life.

The organ looks like a big sponge, a triangular sponge tied around the middle by a green ribbon. All the holes in the sponge are fed by the capillaries of the bloodstream and in the middle of each hole is a tube. These tubes take bile, which the liver makes, away from the holes. Small tubes run into bigger tubes all over the liver until they hit one big tube in the middle; on top of that tube is the green ribbon which is the gallbladder.

Here the bile or gall is stored until it is needed in the body. When it is needed, it is released into a channel called the hepatic duct which feeds the bile into the small intestine.

Blood is fed into the liver by the hepatic artery, one of the abdominal branches of the aorta, the big artery of the body. This enters the lower backside of the liver. The portal vein from the intestines feeds into the lower frontside of the liver. So both the bloodstream and the digestive tract feed into the liver.

And the liver feeds back to both the bloodstream and the digestive tract. The hepatic veins take waste material from the top middle of the liver into the vein system that feeds into the right side of the heart. And the hepatic duct feeds from the gallbladder, the organ wrapped around the middle of the liver, to the small intestine.

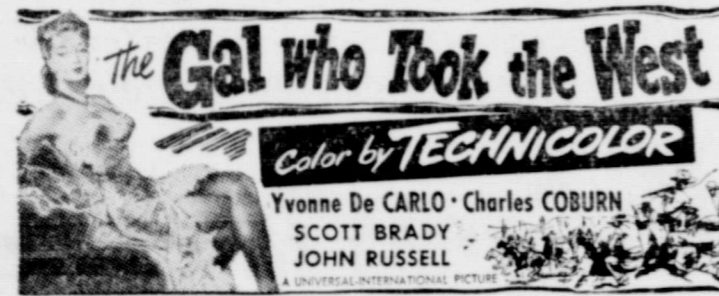

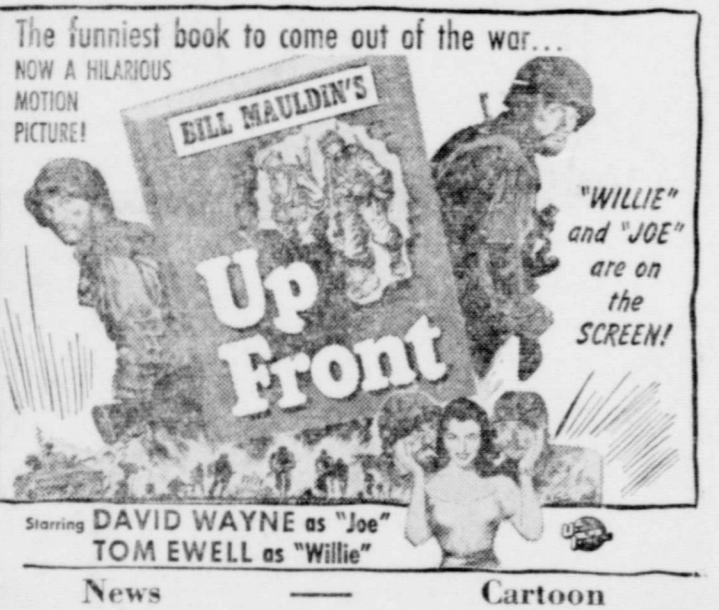

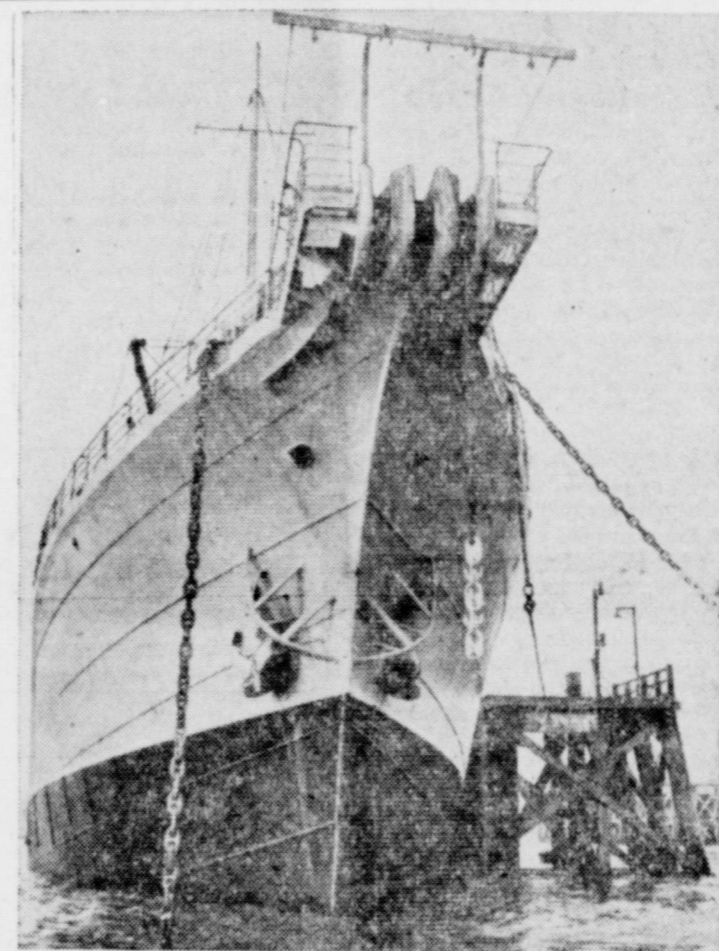
