Reports Saturday indicated that the KLB Drilling Co. No. 1 Weiser a high gas-oil ratio well completed recently in the South Cisco Pool, has been flowing considerably more oil after being given the hydrafrac treatment. No estimate was available, but it was reported to have doubled the oil


