HEALTH TALKS

When a woman is told she has a hernia and passes this information on to her friends, someone is bound to respond, "Why, I thought only men had hernias."

Inguinal hernias, ruptures in the groin, are more obvious than other kinds and are more likely to be detected than any others. Four out of every five hernias are inguinal hernias, but the second most common type of hernia is the femoral hernia which occurs most often in women.

A femoral hernia, sometimes called a crural rupture (crural pertaining to leg) is usually small and painless, often going unnoticed. It will form a little knot toward the inside of the top of the leg, in what is known as the femoral canal.

When the navel or the area immediately around the navel protrudes in a "punchable" knob, it is often due to an umbilical hernia. This rupture may be present at birth or may develop later during the lifetime. It is one of the rare hernias that can usually be corrected by merely keeping the inside organ from popping through the tear in its casing.

In infants umbilical hernia is often only taped to keep the

navel from protruding and the tear in the underlying casing repairs itself, sort of a self-sealing inner tube. In adults and in hernias occurring in other parts of the body, taping and trussing to keep the rupture from protruding are not done to repair the tear, since that is not usually possible, but to "control" the inner part of the organ, to keep it from coming through the torn part.
