Committee formed to assist Prairie Acres

In recent months Prairie Acres Nursing Home and Friona Heritage Estates has encountered financial difficulties. The nursing home is one of only two in the state of Texas that are owned by a city municipality.

The City of Friona became aware in April that the nursing home was having financial difficulty and that a bond interest payment of \$15,000 due in August 2008 along with a bond payment of \$149,000 due in February 2009 were in question.

The main cause of the financial problem has been a decrease in residents at Prairie Acres and Heritage Estates due to a number of deaths of residents over a two-month period. City officials say Prairie Acres needs 67 residents to break even and at this time has about 50 resi-

dents. Heritage Estates has a 16-person capacity and currently has 7 residents.

The city recently hired an outside management company to evaluate the nursing home operations. The contract was for six months at a rate of \$6,750 per month.

In the meantime, many local citizens became concerned the nursing home might be closed or sold to a private company, neither of which are currently under consideration by the city council.

Mayor John Taylor and the city council invited local concerned citizens to volunteer to serve on a fundraising committee to assist Prairie Acres with the approaching bond payment in February. The first meeting of that volunteer group took

place at 6 p.m. Wednesday, September 10, at the city council chambers.

Mayor Taylor, councilman Ronnie Stevick, and city secretary Patricia Phipps, represented the city. Fourteen citizens attended and ideas for various fundraisers were discussed.

The group decided to hold a steak dinner on Sunday, November 2. Additional details will be publicized later.

J. B. Douglas agreed to serve as chairman for the Prairie Acres fundraiser committee. Others attending the September 10 meeting were Wanda and Tommy Jones, Nancy Edelman, Peggy Monroe, Billy Joe Mercer, Johnny Douglas, Stormi Upton, Jyl Grimsley, Beth Shelton, Connie Neeley, Gayle Murdock, Connie Willard, Aundrea Frye, and Sandra Rainey.

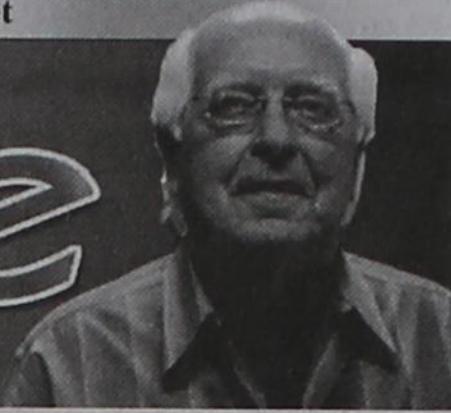

New casserole idea for that next church social

Hey casserole cooks. Tired of taking the same old broccoli and rice casserole to Sunday dinners? If that chicken spaghetti casserole is wearing out its welcome, maybe this recipe I spotted in the USA Weekend magazine will be a nice change of pace.

Not sure why eggplant is called eggplant except it looks like a big purple egg. They say this one is a good antioxidant packed side dish or a vegetarian main dish. It calls for Italian parsley but who's going to know if the parsley is from America?

Tomato Eggplant Casserole

- 2 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 med eggplant in 1-inch cubes
- 1 med yellow onion sliced
- 1 med green pepper chopped
- 1 cup sliced white mushrooms
- 3 cloves garlic crushed or minced
- 1 14.5 oz can no-salt-added diced tomatoes
- 1 8 oz can tomato sauce
- 1/2 cup capers
- 1 cup chopped Italian parsley
- 1 tsp each dried oregano and thyme
- Salt & black pepper to taste
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 375.

In a large saucepan on medium heat, heat oil. Add eggplant. Cook until softened, 10-12 minutes, stirring constantly to prevent sticking.

Remove from heat, add all ingredients except cheese. Transfer mixture to a shallow casserole dish. Sprinkle cheese over top.

Bake 45 minutes, uncovered, until bubbly and brown. Serves 8.

Lakeview School historical marker dedication Sept 21

The Lakeview School historical marker will be dedicated Sunday, September 21, at 2:30 p.m. at the site of the marker. The location is approximately 11 miles southeast of Friona on Highway 2397, County Road 27.

The Lakeview School came into existence in 1928 when the Black School District was divided. Lakeview School consolidated with Friona in 1942. The schoolhouse and teacherage were moved to Friona. The old school house is now located on the east side of the junior high football field along Euclid St.

Ex-students of Lakeview School will share some of the memories of their days spent there. The public is invited to attend the dedication of the Lakeview School marker.

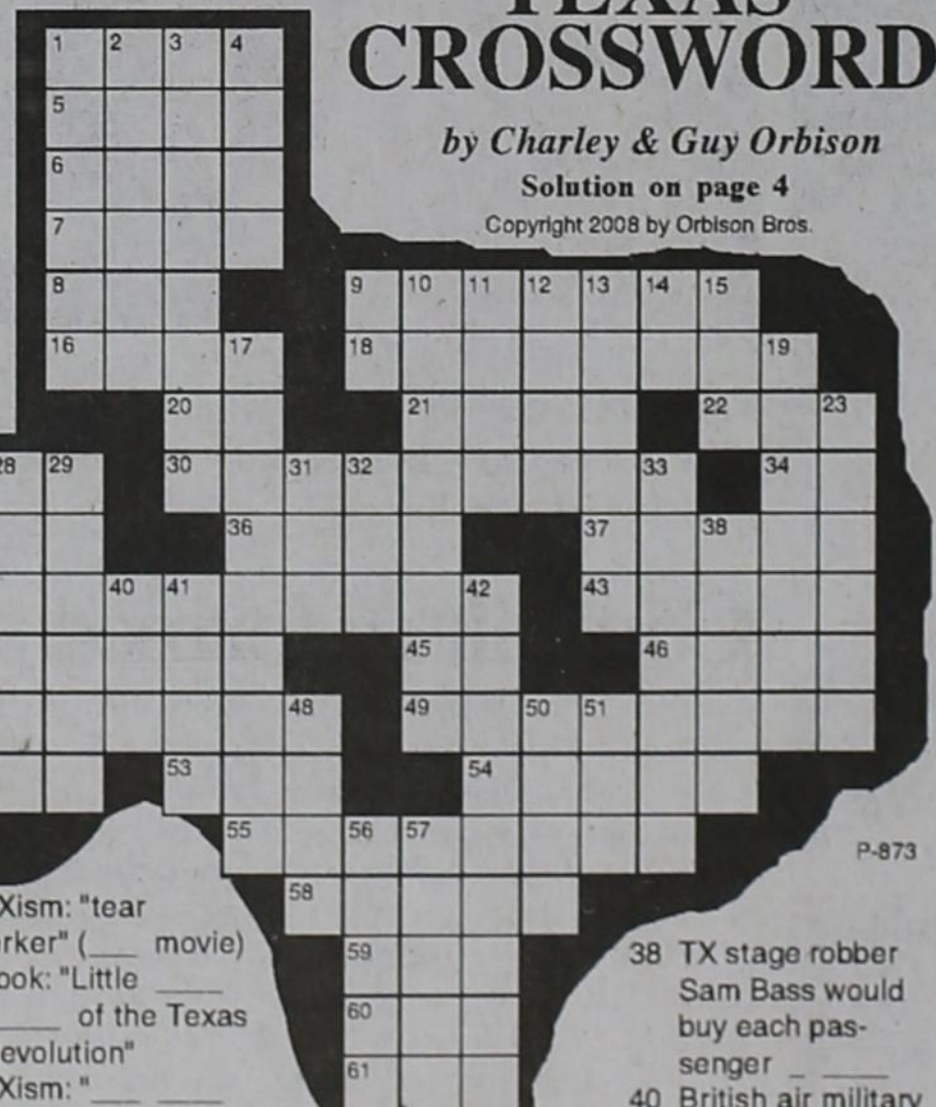

Robert Jones and Tommy St. Clair of Great Plains Ag Credit will be cooking lunch for all area farmers Monday, September 22, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Great Plains office on West Highway 60. The lunch is in observance of National Farm Safety Week September 21-27. Robert and Tommy say 'take a break' and come by for lunch.

Brian Jones, former owner of Inkahoots in Hereford and a resident of Summerfield, has opened an upholstery shop on Main Street in Clovis (see the Jones Upholstery ad in the classifieds). He purchased a building that formerly housed Freeman Formal Wear. Brian learned the upholstery business from his dad. He invites all his friends and customers in the area to come by and visit.

The June hailstorm that caused massive roof damage in Friona has also caused massive damage to County Commissioner Kirk Frye's budget. As new roofs are put on, old shingles come off. The city of Friona decided not to accept the old shingles. Precinct 1 commissioner Frye has been utilizing up to 3 or 4 roll-off box dumpsters a week at the county dump near the Hwy 214 underpass. He normally uses about one roll-off box a month.

Kirk said he charges roofers about \$10 per 100-pounds but that does not offset the cost of pickup and delivery of the dumpsters. So far his precinct has spent over \$9000 accepting the shingles and taken in about half that amount. One maverick roofer did not

want to pay \$50 to dump a pickup load of shingles so he dumped them in a barrow ditch on a county road. He was unlicensed and not bonded and from New Mexico. Sheriff Randy Gerics tracked him down and arrested him.

Parmer County has received \$228,403 from the Office of Rural Community Affairs (ORCA) to assist with infrastructure improvements in colonias. The press release said the money was for "first-time sewer services to 10 households in the colonia area near Lakeside Drive and North 1731 (north and west of the City of Bovina)."

The 2007-08 yearbooks are available for \$45 until December 19. Then they are \$50 from December 19 to May 29, and \$55 after May 29. If you ordered a yearbook you need to pick it up at the high school choir room. Call Allison Johnston for more information at 806-220-1610.

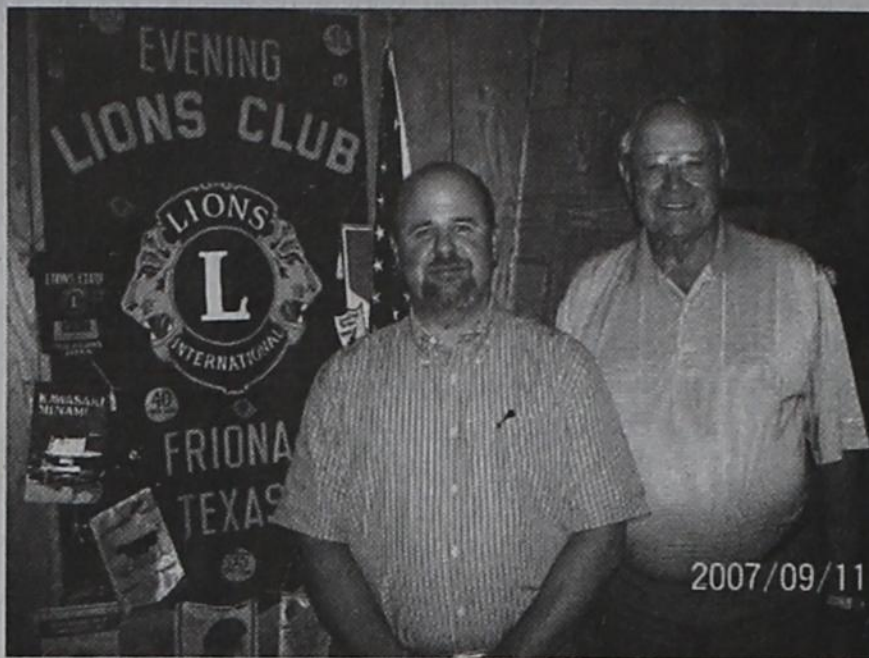

Panhandle Museum celebrates 75 years

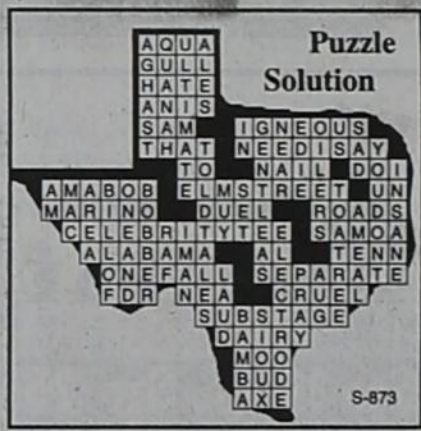
The Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum hosts its annual meeting and formally celebrates its 75th anniversary on Friday, September 26 at 5:30 p.m. in the Hazelwood Lecture Hall. The 75th anniversary exhibit, *Telling Stories, Connecting Lives: PPHM Celebrates 75 Years* opens to the public September 27. It will feature exhibit components over the course of PPHM's history and examine how artifacts connect people to the environment around them. Visitors will travel back in time through the first 75 years of PPHM and enjoy the nostalgia of seeing things they saw in the museum as a child from New Deal dioramas to Tableaux from the original "Fashion Hall". As the museum for the twenty-six counties in the Texas Panhandle and adjacent regions in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas

and Colorado, PPHM dedicated and opened its doors on April 14, 1933. Enjoying a sense of ownership, 1600 people milled through the new building that afternoon. When it opened, PPHM was a 12,500 square foot building with one gallery. Since then, PPHM has become the largest history museum in Texas with 22 galleries and more than two million artifacts and continues to instill a "sense of ownership" for visitors today. The role of the museum remains the same today as when it began. As Hattie Anderson so eloquently expressed her dream, "It is the sacred duty of ours to collect the record of life here and hand this on to the children of the future...and we believe in the future our people will point with pride to their Museum and the Historical Society."

Commissioners approve pay raises, take on roadside park, set early voting

Parmer County commissioners last week approved a 5-percent across-the board pay increase for county employees. Elected officials also received raises on an individual basis. Early voting was set as follows for the November 4 general election: early voting at FirstBank Bovina October 22, 24, & 29; early voting at Friona State Bank October 21, 23, 28, & 30. The early voting period is October 20 through October 31 and can be done at the courthouse in Farwell during that time. Commissioners approved County Tax Assessor Bobbie Pierson's request to offer auto tag sales at the Friona Chamber of Commerce office. Auto registration had been offered at the Friona Credit Union for many years but they gave it up.

The roadside park just east of Friona was transferred from TxDOT to Parmer County. Precinct 1 commissioner Kirk Frye's group will now maintain the roadside park. TxDOT has been transferring or closing many roadside parks recently. The roadside park south of Bovina was closed last year. County commissioners meet every other Monday. Two future meetings of the county commissioners were changed to be on Tuesday September 23 and Tuesday October 14.

Comptroller distributes September sales tax

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced that the state collected \$2 billion in sales tax in August, up 7.7 percent compared to a year ago. "When the state's 2008 fiscal year ended August 31, sales tax collections totaled \$21.5 billion, 6.6 percent higher than in fiscal 2007," Combs said. "Although this was not the double-digit increases seen in 2006 and 2007, growth in state sales tax collections during fiscal 2008 continued at a steady pace." Combs distributed \$491.9 million in September sales tax payments to local governments, a 10 percent increase compared to September 2007. So far this calendar year, local sales tax allocations are up 6.7 percent compared to the same period in 2007. September's sales tax allocations include local sales taxes collected in July and reported to the Comptroller in August. Parmer County's September 2008 payment totaled \$42,259.54 broken down as Bovina \$6,244.89; Farwell \$7,740.83; and Friona \$28,273.82. In September 2007, the tax payment total was \$37,840.03. Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 11.67%, broken down as Bovina -1.59%; Farwell 7.55%; and Friona 16.37%. For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$371,239.53 as compared to \$363,807.50 for the same period last year, a 2.04% change. The Comptroller's next local sales tax allocation will be made Friday, October 10.



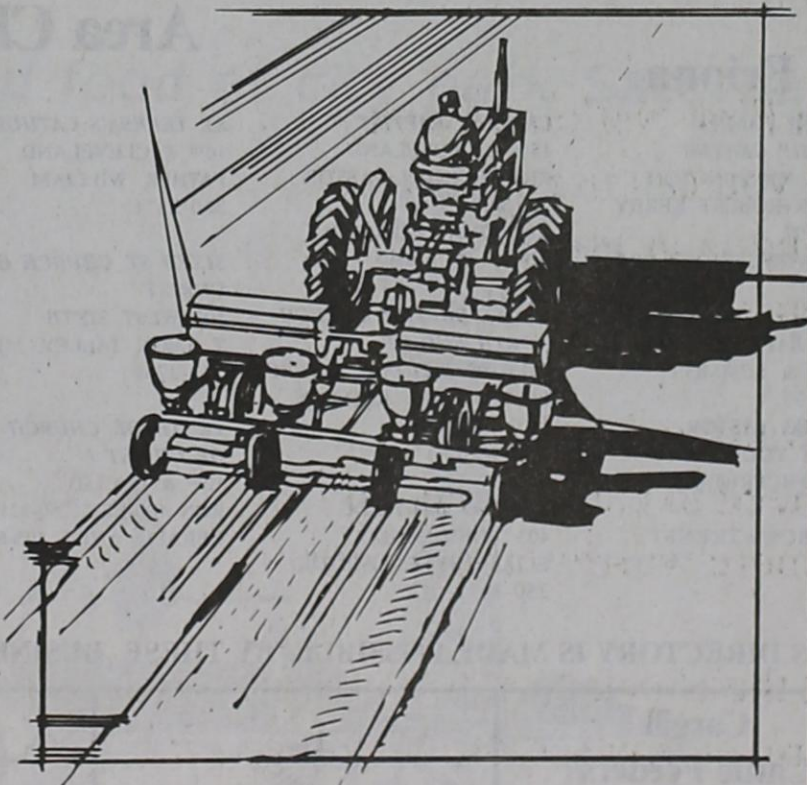

"When you give, the left hand should not know that the right hand is giving." Matthew 6:3-4.

For those of us who are right-handed please forgive me for speaking of my right hand as the one in control. Those that have two hands have one that does most of the work.

My right hand is more flexible, stronger, and yet it never tells the left hand this. My left hand does the combing, the brushing of the teeth, and the feeding of the mouth but it never lets the right hand know about this.

Neither hand has a complex. The right hand never feels superior to the left, nor the left inferior to the right. My right hand holds a hammer and the left hand holds the nail. When I hang a portrait and my right hand hits the wrong nail the left hand is hurting.

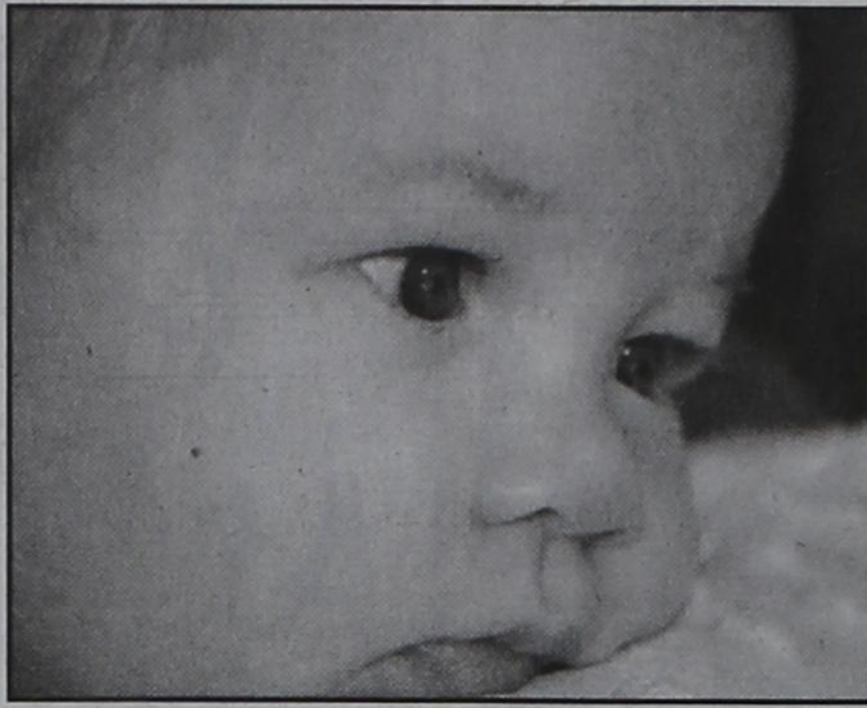
My right hand immediately holds my left hand in comfort. The right hand holds the left; it even will make sure to stop the bleeding. One offers support, the other receives comfort.

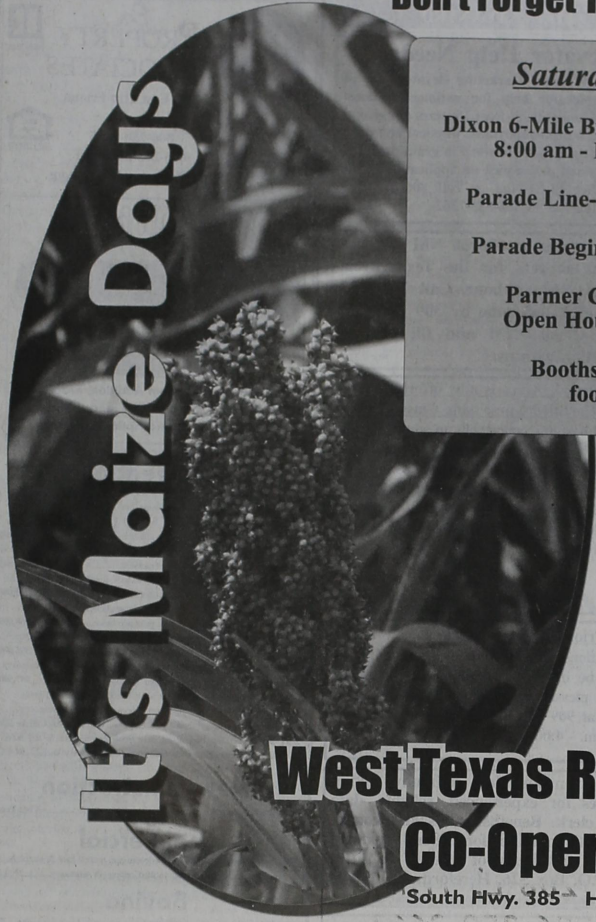

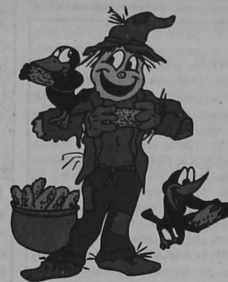

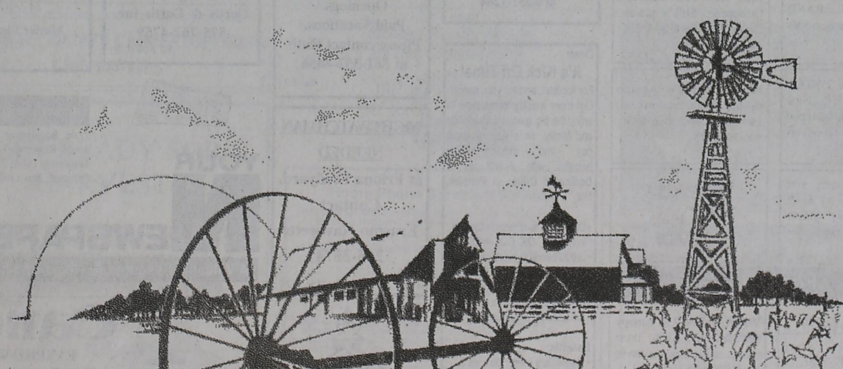

Water district No.1 approves tax rate

High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 Board of Directors approved a resolution adopting a 2008 ad valorem tax rate of \$.00794 per \$100 property valuation for operation and maintenance of the district during their September 9 meeting.

This is the same rate as approved for 2007. "While this is the same rate adopted by the Board last year, the increased property valuation caused the proposed tax rate to exceed the 2008 effective

rate. Because of this, the district conducted public hearings on August 21 and August 28 at its Lubbock office to give constituents an opportunity to comment on the proposed 2008 tax rate," said Manager Jim Conkright. He added that the district did not receive any negative comments concerning the proposed 2008 ad valorem tax rate. At the 2008 rate, persons with \$100,000 in property valuation pay \$7.94 in taxes to the underground water conservation district.

Created in September 1951 by local residents and the state legislature, the High Plains Underground Water District No. 1 works to conserve, preserve, and protect groundwater stored in the Ogallala aquifer within its 15-county service area.

Chiefs roll over the Road 20-12

The Friona Chieftains went into the win column Friday night against their old rivals, the River Road Wildcats. All the action took place in the first half as the Chiefs led 20-9 at the break, then held the Wildcats to a field goal in the fourth quarter to give Coach Mike Herbert his first win as Friona's head coach.

a quick 14-0 first quarter lead on two Chieftain drives capped by two rushing touchdowns from junior running back Jonathan Licerio. Jonathan carried 9 times for 34 yards, caught one pass for 8 yards, and punted 3 times for 132 yards.

Sophomore running back Zack Fair was the star of the night as he put together a total of 172 yards on of-

fense. Zack carried 7 times for 50 yards, caught 2 passes for 51 yards (longest 44), and ran a kickoff back 71 yards to set up the Chiefs touchdown in the 2nd quarter. And he caught the touchdown pass from Joey Dickson after the runback.

Fair, a quarterback in junior high, also rifled a half back pass just out of reach of receiver Matthew Stanberry which would have given the Chiefs field position inside the Wildcat 10-yard line.

Joey Mendoza carried 10 times for 31 yards, Noe Saenz 2 for 14 yards, and Dickson 4 for 40. Dickson also completed 5 of 9 pass attempts for 44 yards. Justin Dominguez also completed 1 of 1 passes, a 44-yard toss to Fair. David Schwab, Matthew Stanberry, and Justin Echevarria each had one pass reception for the Chiefs who had a total of 171 yards rushing and 88 passing.

The Chieftain defense allowed the Wildcats 312 offensive yards, 160 rushing and 152 passing. Ricardo Monreal was credited with 7 unassisted tackles. Teammate Noe Saenz had 6 unassisted tackles. Others in the unassisted tackle column were Ernesto Monreal (3), Rodrigo Vasquez (3), Justin Echevarria (2), Zack Fair (2), Joey Mendoza (2), and David Schwab (1).

The Chiefs intercepted three Wildcat passes, one each by Matthew Stanberry, Ernesto Monreal, and Ricardo Monreal.

The Chieftains will host the Sudan Hornets Friday night as the annual homecoming game. According to Friona sports historian Bill Ellis it will be the first time the Chiefs have played Sudan since 1964.

Chieftain defensive starters Alex Dunnam and Alex Vega are both out with knee injuries. Dunnam is likely to be out for six weeks and Vega for at least three weeks.

The Friona junior varsity traveled to River Road last Thursday and beat the JV Wildcats 30-0. Scoring were Raul Anchondo who covered a muffed punt in the endzone; Valentin Rocha caught a 25-yard pass from Brenner Barnett; Josh Duenes scored on a 3-yard run; Caleb Monroe scored on an 8-yard run; Brenner Barnett, Serafin Basquez, and Alan Tafoya each scored 2-point conversions. Coach Rex Cumpton said, "Both the defense and offense played real well. We also played well on special teams. We were able to score a special teams touchdown and Dominique Kellum had a good punt return."

The JV Chiefs will host Abernathy JV here tonight, Thursday September 18.

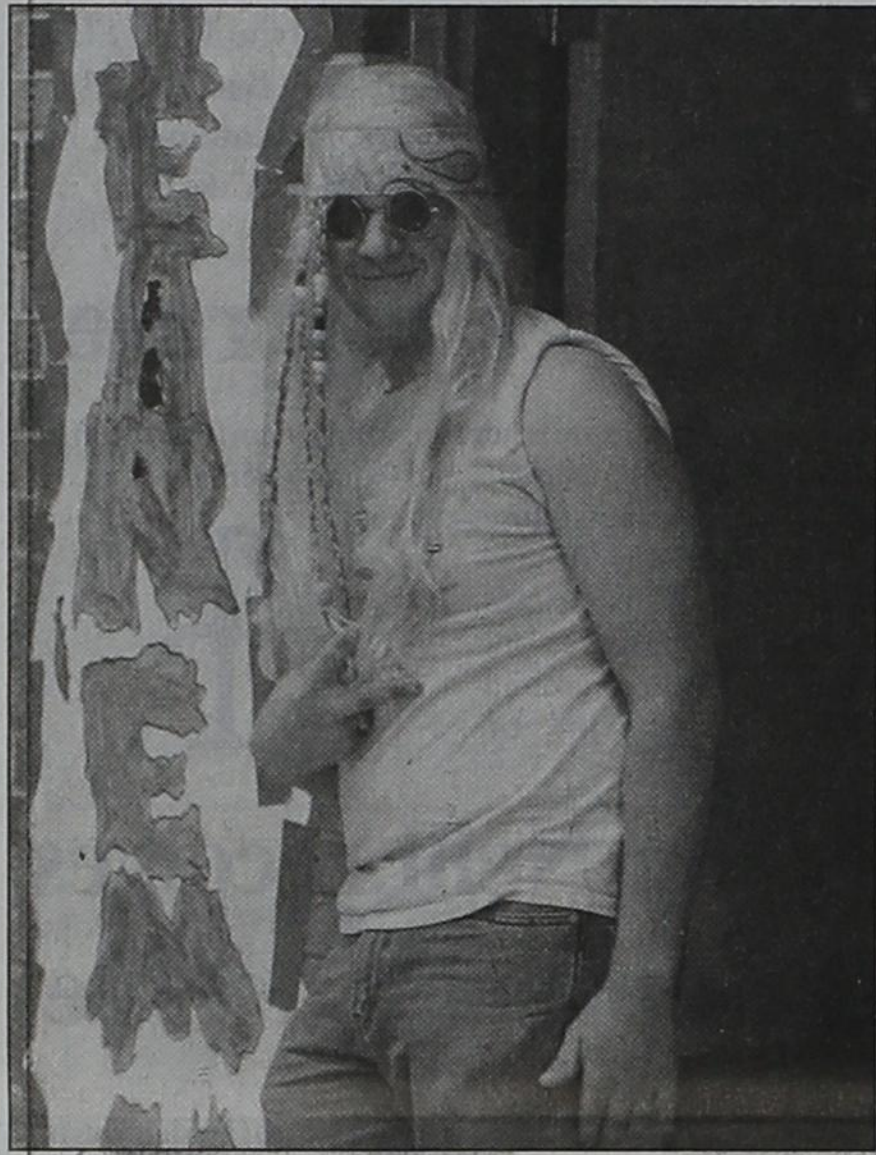
Chief video doubleheader Oct 4

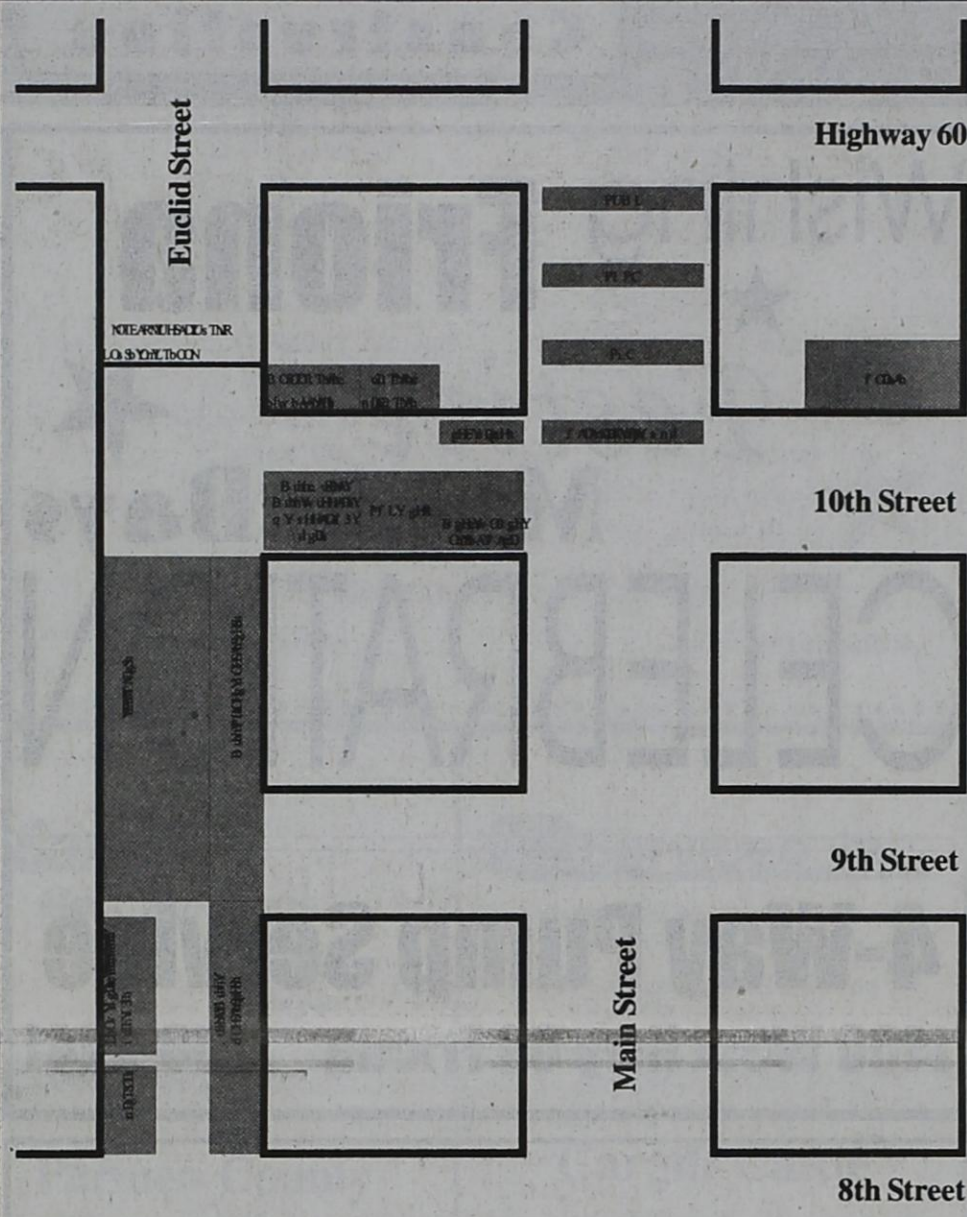

4. Total countable resources and assets cannot exceed \$2000 or \$3000 if the household contains a relative who is aged or disabled. The value of a car greater than \$4650 is counted against the \$2000 limit. Personal possessions and homestead are exempt assets.
5. Eligible persons must be a resident of Parmer County Hospital District, Texas.
6. Applicants must provide all information and documentation that is required.
7. Applicants must apply for any other private, state or federal assistance program for which they are potentially eligible and must apply for employment opportunities at the Texas Workforce Commission. The program is payer of last resort.
8. Applicants have the right to appeal denials.

Please note that on November 10, 2008 the Parmer County Hospital District Board of Directors will hold a Public Hearing regarding proposed changes affecting programs benefits.

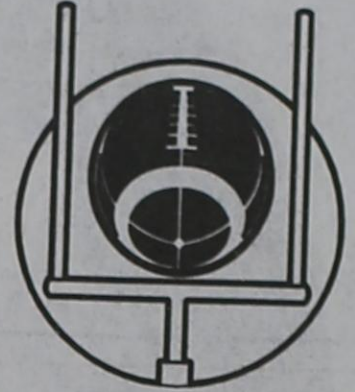

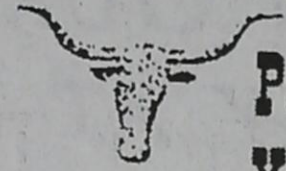

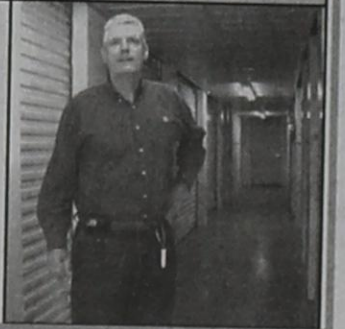
