Stop Navarro Is Big Problem In Grid Conference

Who's going to stop high flying Navarro? That's the big question in Texas Junior College Athletic Conference circles.

And the general and logical answer is — no one.

Not only the TJCAC — usually considered a weak conference — but in outside play, the Navarro Bulldogs have racked up wins. Del Mar, then ranked the number 1 JC team in the nation, lost to Ranger. Arlington State is now considered a likely participant in the Junior Rose Bowl. However, both these teams have been beaten by a common foe — Navarro. The Bulldogs shutout Ranger, 12-0, and dumped Arlington State, 25-19.

Apparently irked by being ignored by early bowl seekers, Coach Lee Smith's Bulldogs are now geared for action which might change the minds of those seeking a JC team worthy to represent Texas in the Coast attraction.

Saturday night Navarro displayed its power by smashing

Decatur, 47-0. The one-two punch of Weldon Symes and John Carraway accounted for all six TDs. Symes, an elusive broken field runner especially adapted for end sweeps, squirted across the double stripe four times. Carraway, a 208 pound fullback with the power of a tank, added the other two counters.

Tommy Jordan is the man under in the Bulldog T. A smart field general and excellent passer, Jordan keeps the defense baffled. Besides Symes and Carraway, Jordan can hand off to Ken Bailey, Bobby Staggs or a host of other capable backs who can really scamper. Ends Charles Stack and Orville Langston are

fine pass receivers. Either is a good target for Jordan's aeriels. With only one blimish — an early season loss to Kilgore — should the Bulldogs continue their devastating point production and stubborn defense to remain undefeated the rest of the season, they might receive a bouquet of roses and become the first TJCAC team ever to pay in the Junior Rose Bowl Classic.

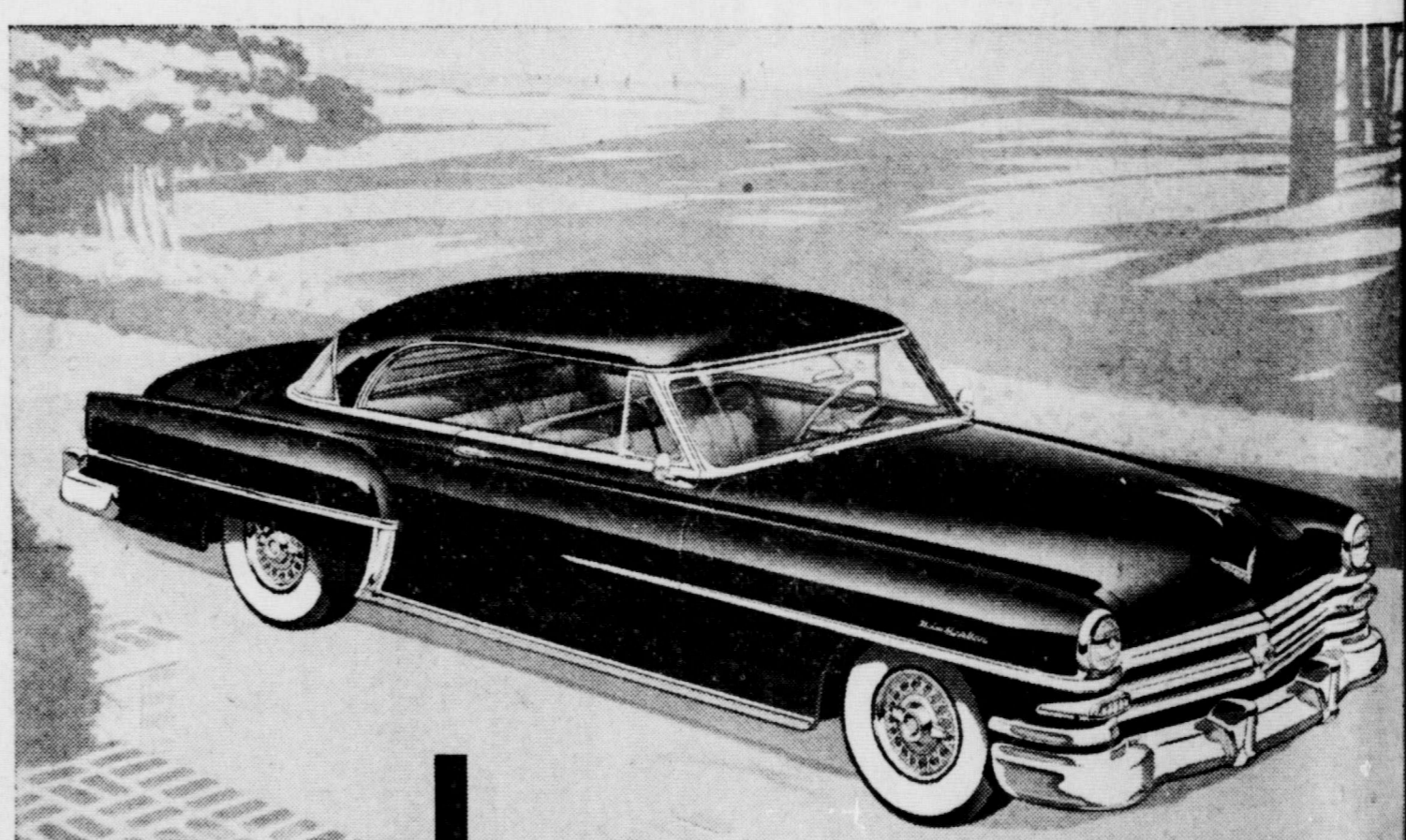
