## Benefits for the Working Family

Furthermore, the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT) exemptions were continued. The AMT helps cover 13 million Americans that therwise would not qualify after the January $1^{8}$ deadline. This measure protects certain taxpayers by exempting from the AMT the
first $\$ 58,000$ of a married couple's income and $\$ 40,250$ for a single individual. The AMT, along with the included 10 percent tax bracket extension, provides significant help to middle and low-income Ameriextensio
cans.

Additional benefits were included for military families and Ameri can schools. Under this bill, soldiers living in combat zones are provided higher child credit refunds and earned income tax credits. It is the least we can do for our troops sacrificing so much. Elementary
and secondary school teachers, among other educators, are eligible and secondary school teachers, among other educators, are eligible
for approximately $\$ 250$ in deductions for personal payment of classroom expenses. This above-the-line deduction rightly defrays some of the expenditures our children's educators voluntarily make to enhance the quality of each student's education.
I have long believed taxpayers make better use of their money than the government ever could. Time and time again, the American people have proven that to be the case. They know how to handle heir money to best provide for themselves, the economy and our
