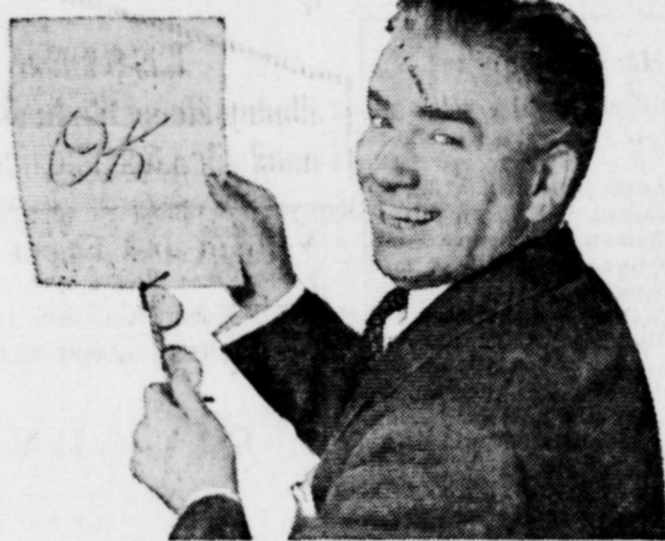

Minister's Week Will Be Observed At Dallas School

DALLAS, Jan. 31. - More than 1,000 ministers of all faiths will be on the Southern Methodist University campus February 2-5 for the university's 18th annual Ministers' Week, an event that has become the largest of its kind in Protestantism.

Three noted speakers will deliver a series of lectures during the four-day meeting, which is designed to produce a better-trained ministry. Lectures will be given daily in McFarlin Memorial Auditorium, with many affiliated committees meeting in other campus buildings during the week.

Bishop Arthur J. Moore, of the Atlanta area, will discuss "The World Task of the Church." Bishop Moore is one of the leading mission workers for the Methodist Church, and since 1945 he has been sent by the Council of Bishops to emergency situations in Korea, Germany, Japan, Malaya, and Europe.

Also speaking will be Dr. Albert C. Outler of SMU's Perkins School of Theology. He will talk on "Psychotherapy and the Christian Message." Dr. Outler represented the South-Central Jurisdiction of the Methodist Church of the U. S. at the Third World Conference on Faith and Order at Lund, Sweden, last autumn.

Third member of the featured speaking trio is Dr. R. B. Y. Scott of the Divinity School at McGill University, Montreal, Canada. His lecture series is titled "Our Old Testament Inheritance." Dr. Scott is chairman of the Study Commission of the Canadian Council of Churches.

Jane Huestis, Patsy King, and Ruth Beaty, of the music department of Cisco Junior College, opened the program by singing "Book of Books." Rev. Sidney Spain, pastor of the First Christian Church, who are conducting Bible courses at C.J.C., spoke of their work with the college age and the adult classes.

Following the program a short business session was held during which correspondence, committee reports, and a report of the department chairman were heard and acted upon. The club voted to buy a five dollar bond from the Texas TB Association and to give six dollars to the local Polio fund.

## New Deer Tag Is Planned For Use In Fall Hunting

AUSTIN, Jan. 31. — The Texas Game and Fish Commission tentatively decided to replace the present paper deer tag used by hunters.

Meeting in quarterly session in Austin, the Commission agreed that a proposed new metal tag would be preferable.

The Commissioners reported the present paper tag is too difficult to affix permanently to a carcass, as provided by law, and also held that the paper tag sometimes is re-used.

The theory behind the tag, according to the Executive Secretary, is to identify the owner of harvested deer and to prevent any individual from taking more than two deer per season under the General Law.

The Commission postponed discussion of a proposed law permitting a block of Hill Country counties to experiment with a limited doe harvest as a means of balancing the deer herds. Two Marble Falls men — Vern Dillon and Jack Crownover — appeared before the Commission to

suggest that the present system for taking buck deer is preferable.

The Commission approved purchase of the J. C. Gambill Wildlife Refuge near Paris, subject to final sanction of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service which would provide three-fourths of the funds under the Pittman-Robertson Act. It acted after the Executive Secretary reported that a minimum of 411 acres should be added to the present 702-acre refuge to make the area manageable. The Commission also agreed to study possibility of using part of the refuge for propagating quail.

The Commission postponed action on increasing the Gene Howe Restoration Area near Canadian and also delayed consideration of proposed pass construction on the Gulf Coast, pending further study.
