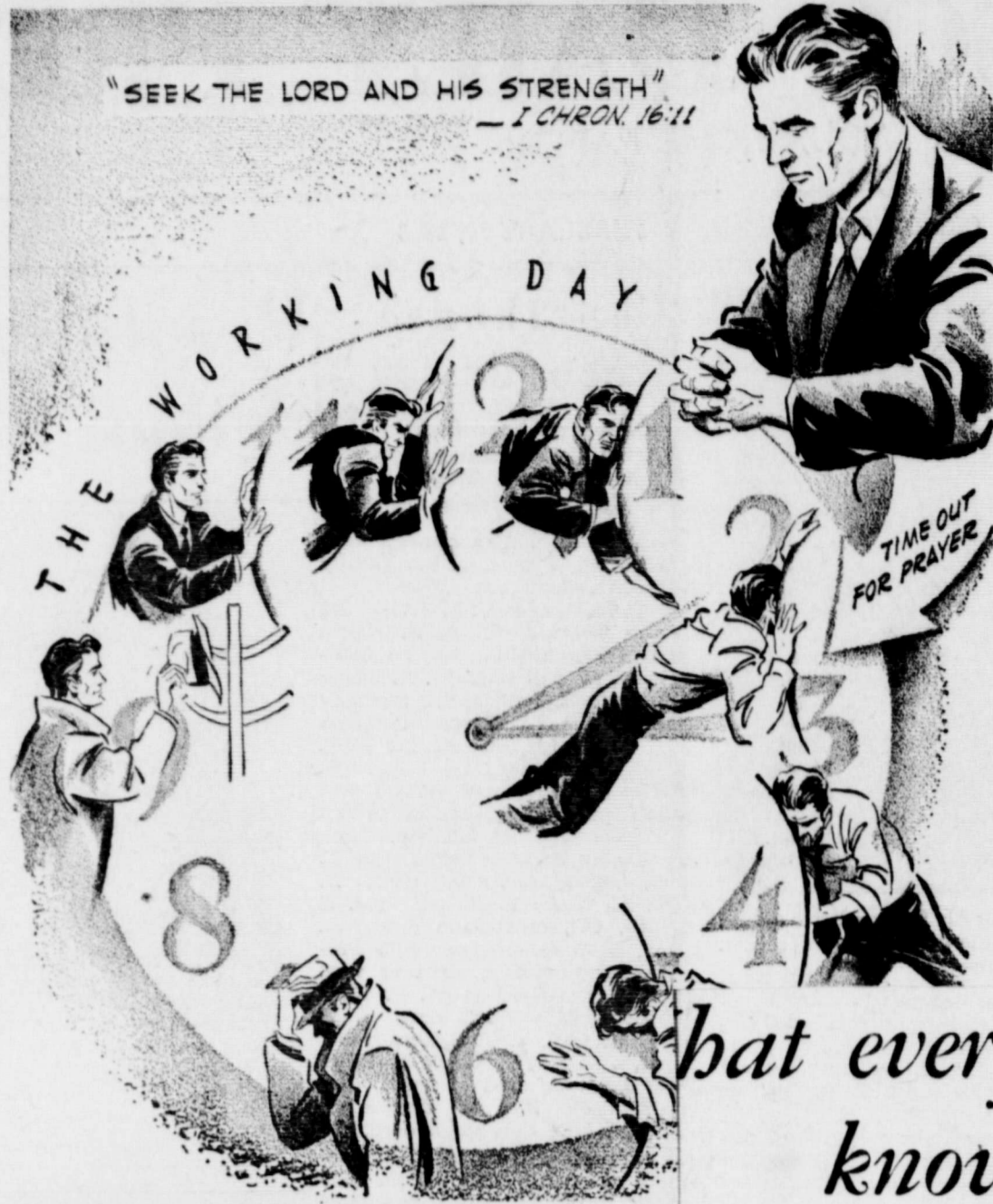

Texas Industry To Hold Special Week In April

HOUSTON, Feb. 6.—Texas business and industry will tell its story to the public during the first week of April — fourth annual observance of Texas Industrial Week, Ed C. Burris, executive vice president of the Texas Manufacturers Association, said today.

Governor Allan Shivers, in an official memorandum, has just set aside the week for organizations and citizens to point up the part industry is playing in the continuing economic expansion and development of Texas.

TMA, which coordinates the statewide observance, and Chambers of Commerce throughout Texas will carry out industrial-emphasis programs, Mr. Burris said.

Early indications from a TMA survey of Chambers of Commerce point toward the 1953 observance as being the most extensive since the Texas Legislature in 1951 officially designated April 1 through 7 as Texas Industrial Week, Mr. Burris said.

Chambers, who spearhead observances in their respective cities, already are planning industrial fairs, showing products made in their cities; "Open houses" and plant tours for school children and the general public, and joint meetings between teachers, legislators, and businessmen to discuss mutual problems.

TMA, for the fourth year, will sponsor a competition for the best industrial-emphasis programs, Mr. Burris said. Last year, the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce won the grand award and first place in its population grouping. Other first place winners were San Antonio, Pampa and Coleman.

Certificate of merit winners were Houston, Beaumont, Tyler, Denison, Lufkin (Angelina County Chamber of Commerce), McAllen, Aransas Pass, and Dumas.

Shepperd Given Appointment To National Board

AUSTIN, Feb. 7. — Appointment of Texas Attorney General John Ben Shepperd as a member of the committee on Submerged Lands of the National Association of Attorneys General was announced today by Attorney General Roy H. Beeler of Tennessee, chairman.

Other Attorneys General on the committee announced by Beeler are Edmund G. Brown, of California; Fred S. LeBlanc, Louisiana; Frank G. Millard, Michigan; George C. Conway, Connecticut; and D. E. Rollins, Maryland.

Congressional hearings on submerged land bills will begin the following week, and committee members will testify at these hearings.

Shepperd said that he hopes to assist the Texas delegation in securing a bill giving Texas fair treatment.

"The Texas delegation has always been in the forefront in Congress," he said, "and without their work the tidelands would have been lost long ago."

He termed the Texas delegation in Congress "the bulwark in the defense of Texas tidelands."

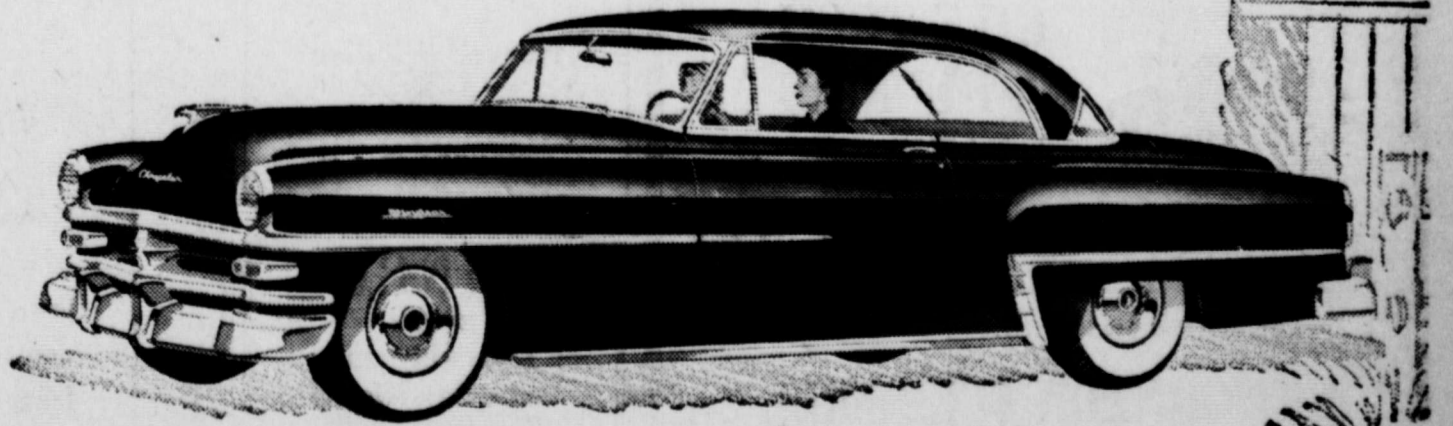

Doctors And Park Rangers Will Be Hired In Exams

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced new examinations for medical officers and park rangers.

The Medical Officer examination will be used to fill positions in various specialized fields of medicine, with salaries ranging from \$5,940 to \$10,800 a year. The positions are principally in the Bureau of Indian Affairs located on reservations west of the Mississippi River and in Alaska. A few positions may be filled in the Fish and Wildlife Service.

Applicants must be fully qualified as doctors of medicine, and for most positions must be currently licensed to practice medicine and surgery in a State or Territory of the United States. Appropriate experience is required. Maximum age limits for positions in the Bureau of Indian Affairs are 50 and 55 years, waived up to 62 years for persons entitled to veteran preference. For positions in the Fish and Wildlife Service, the maximum age limit is 62 years (waived for persons entitled to veteran preference).

Park Ranger positions, paying

\$3,410 a year, are in the National Park Service, located at national parks and monuments throughout the country. Applicants for these positions must pass a written test and must have had appropriate experience or education. Age limits are from 21 to 35, waived for persons entitled to veteran preference.

Further information and application forms may be obtained from the Commission's local secretary, Sam King, at the Cisco Post Office, or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, 25, D. C. Applications for Medical Officer will be accepted until further notice by the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior, Washington 25, D. C. Applications for Park Ranger will be accepted until March 10, 1953, by the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, National Park Service, Department of the Interior, Washington 25, D. C.

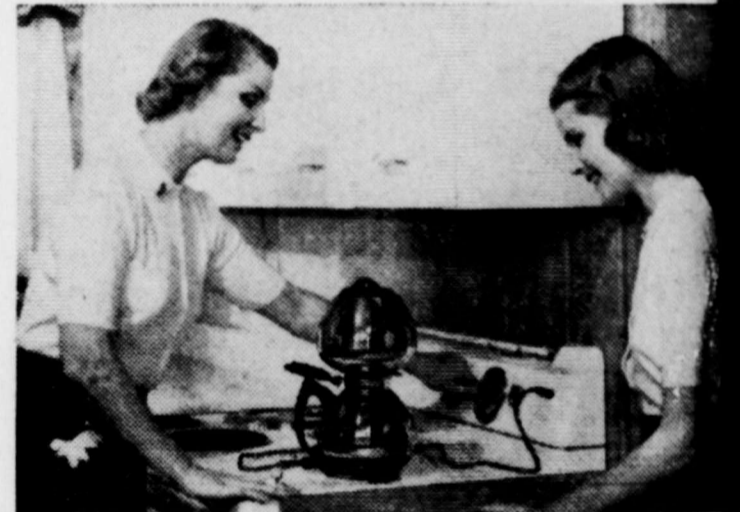
