

## **Local Group Has** Meeting At Bank

A resolution opposing House Bill 3, which asks the Texas Legslature to change the basis of determining individual school districts' contribution to the state education foundation fund, was adopted by a meeting of some 50 Cisco business men and taxpayers Monday night at the First Natio-

The proposed legislation was explained by Superintendent Arlin Bint of the city school system. He estimated that passage of the bill would cost the Cisco school district \$23,000 next year and increased amounts in following

The only way the Cisco district could meet its present obligations and pay additional money into the state's foundation fund, Mr. Bint pointed out, would be to raise school taxes. He estimated that the proposed change in the school law would force Cisco school patrons to raise their school tax rate about 40 cents.

The proposed law, if passed, would eliminate any hopes the Cisco school district might have for erecting new and modern buildings, it was pointed out.

The resolution as adopted by the Cisco meeting and forwarded to State Rep. Omar Burkett and State Senator Wayne Wagonseller of this district endorsed House Bill 216 and Senate Bill 24, which would enable teacher's salaries to be raised but keep the foundation fund contribution in its present

The meeting was sponsored by the Cisco Chamber of Commerce.


