Changing the top sheet and overs on a bed occupied by a patient isn't too bad, but what bugbear the bottom linen seems to the inexperienced home nurse After the bath and other grooming has been finished, the bed linen may be changed. If the patient must remain in bed he is turned on his side and moved as far as possible toward one side of the bed. If he is weak or unable to turn easily omeone should stand on each side of the bed to make it. The soiled bottom sheet

olled up from the vacant side to the patient's back. After the mattress covering is straightened, a clean sheet is put into position, tucked at two corners and the loose side rolled on top the roll of soiled sheet. The patient is turned on his back across the rolled cover toward the opposite side so that the soiled sheet can be completely removed and the fresh one pulled smooth and tucked at the remaining corners When the bottom sheet is put

on the bed, another folded in


