### Long Heat Wave Is Ended Monday In This Region

A general rain that measured from one and a half inches to more than four inches over this area Monday night brightened the farm and ranch outlook, raised the water level at Lake Cisco some 24 inches, and brought cooler weather to a region that had gone through some 21 days of 100-plus temperatures.

A survey showed that all of Eastland County received rainfall in varying amounts. Callahan, Stephens and Shackelford Counties also benefitted from the regional rainfall.
