Apollo Choir To Have Tryouts In Houston Jan. 25

Cisco area boys will have an opportunity to try for membership in the world-famous Apollo Boys' Choir at the First Methodist Church in Houston, Monday afternoon, Jan. 25, at 3 o'clock. All boys between the ages of 9 and 14 with attractive unchanged voices and better than average school grades are eligible.

Application blanks may be procured by writing to the Apollo Choir School, Box 1088, Palm Beach, Florida, or will be available at the time of the audition. Each applicant is requested to furnish two letters of recommendation, a copy of current school grades, and a small photograph.

Contestants will be asked to sing two songs of their own choosing, either with or without accompaniment. Boys selected from this audition will be invited to participate in the National Finals at the Apollo Choir School in Palm Beach on January 31st, when the director, Coleman Cooper will award \$7200 in scholarships to the seven winners.

Members of the Apollo Choir live in a beautiful estate overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, where they receive their musical and academic training. Twice each year they go on nationwide concert tours, appearing in Colleges, Universities, and on regular concert series from coast-to-coast. This group has been acclaimed by critics as America's finest aggregation of boy singers.

Care Has Record Number Of Xmas Packages Mailed

NEW YORK, Jan. 19.—Americans sent more CARE packages abroad as Christmas gifts last month than in any previous December during the seven years of the agency's operations. Paul Comly French, executive director of the Cooperative for American Remittances to Everywhere, Inc., announced at its headquarters, 660 First Ave., New York City.

A total of 374,173 CARE packages of various types were subscribed in December, 1953, French

stated. The previous record for the month was December, 1947, when CARE orders totalled 312,000 packages.

French attributed the increase to public interest in two projects CARE stressed during the holiday season: "Operation Reindeer", which brought needy families in Europe and Latin America a special \$1 Christmas package containing foods released free of charge by the United States Foreign Operations Administration, and the "CARE for Korean Children" Campaign.

The drive to provide relief packages for Korean war orphans and other destitute children is continuing, French pointed out, with a new \$4 CARE food package just prepared to meet cur-

rent needs. The package, containing 16 pounds of milk powder, butter and canned beef in gravy, may be ordered for distribution in Korea through any CARE office. Delivery is guaranteed to designated recipients or to orphanages, hospitals and needy families chosen by the CARE Mission Chief in Korea.
