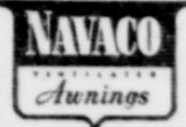

Texas in Review can be seen Monday over KRBC-TV, Abilene, 8 p. m., and other stations.

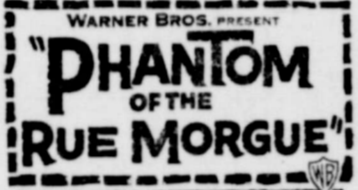

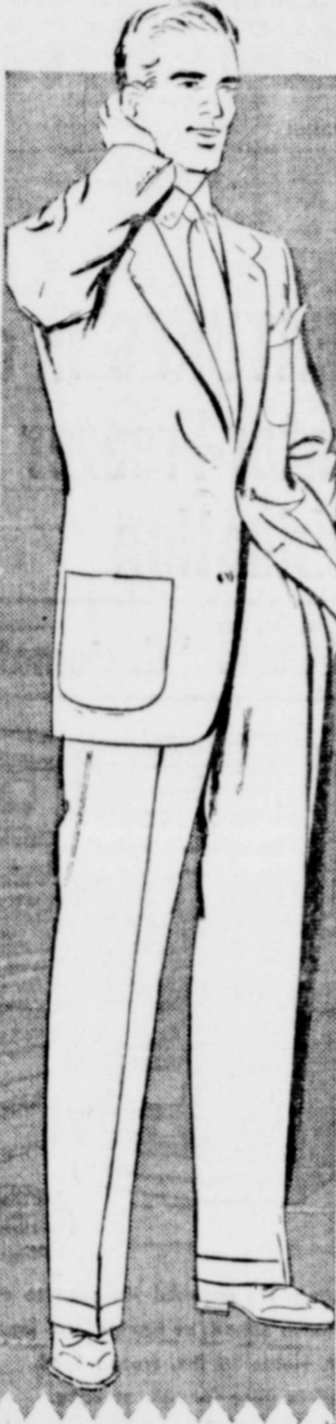

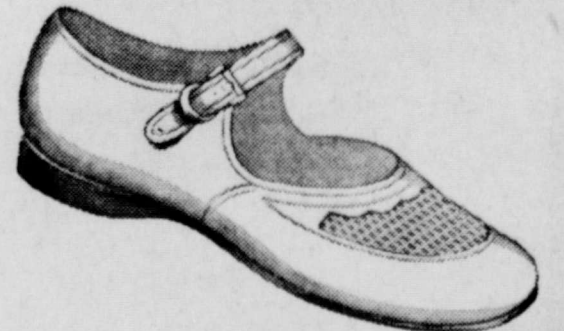
