

The 1A school has a total enrollment of about 400 students, 1st grade through high school.

Crum's official resignation has not been tendered. School districts are required to wait for 21days after hiring a superintendent before it becomes official. The announcement was made to students and staff at the high school when classes resumed Tuesday.

Earlier in the year elementary principal Becky Riethmayer announced her resignation and junior high principal Kevin Wiseman will retire after this year. Taking over as elementary principal is Martha Soliz from Amarillo Highland Park. Her husband Victor Soliz joined FISD earlier this year as a math teacher and assistant coach.

The new junior high principal is Mark Sundrie who comes to Friona from the Odessa ISD, where has filled principal positions for 16 years. Both the Sundrie and Soliz families are currently in the process of finding housing in Friona.

In small mixing bowl combine sour cream with horseradish, sweet pickle relish, and pickled jalapenos. Cover and chill.




Kimbrough grandson to attend seminary

Growing old can be good

America is growing older. Each year the average age of it's citizens creeps up. Each of us is growing older, yet we sometimes try to escape that reality. Our youth oriented culture blinds us to the realities of our own aging.

Many people think of aging as if it were some kind of disease because along with it comes a series of problems like ill health or loneliness.

Aging does have its problems but it also has great hope and anticipation for those who love the Lord. Those who love the Lord accept aging as a natural part of life.

Douglas McArthur had an essay about age that hung on his office wall. A line from it said, "Youth is not a time of life, it is a state of mind. You are as young as your faith, as old as your doubts, as young as your hopes and as old as your despair."

I read that there are presently over 23 million Americans 65 years or older. For some, the stereotype is to think that all these people are poor, isolated, sick, cantankerous and unhappy. It's no wonder that many of us find the prospect of growing old so unattractive.
