### National Guard To Have Exhibit At Dallas Fair

Texans attending the State Fair of Texas Oct. 9-24 in Dallas will have an opportunity to get acquainted first-hand with Texas National Guard's 49th Armored Division.

Maj. Gen. Albert Sidney Johnson, the division commander, has announced plans for a large-scale exhibit of the division's armament at a prominent place on the fairgrounds.

The division will exhibit, among other things, its M-41 (Walker Bull Dog) light tank, M-47 (Patton) medium tank and the armored personnel carrier for infantrymen.

Representatives of the division will be on hand to explain the equipment. Specially-constructed ramps will enable visitors to see inside the tanks.

The 49th Armored Division has units in fifty-five Texas cities, principally in North, East and Central Texas. Out-of-town visitors who are members of the di-

holds failed on the point after attempt.

The Yellowhammers came back strong in the third period and took the opening kick back to the Cisco 22. Jim Waddell took the ball on his own 10 and was shaken loose at midfield. He was overtaken at the 22 by Tackle Ed Bernie who dropped him from behind. Runs by Black, Milton and Funk carried to the Lobo five where Minton fumbled and an alert Cisco linesman pounced on the ball. On the first play Rotan drew a five yard penalty, placing the ball on the Cisco 10. From that point Tommy Reynolds pulled a sneak through the line and went 90 yards for the score. Key blocks broke him past the secondary and he outran the pursuing Yellowhammers. Reynolds' kick was good and the score stood at 20-0.

Rotan took the kickoff on the 15 and brought it up to the 25. Funk fumbled and Cisco recovered on the Rotan 28. On the first play Marcos Gallegos went the 23 yards to score. Lipsey kicked the extra point and the score stood at 27-0.

Cisco kicked off to Rotan and Black took the ball from his own 15 to his 34. Waddell lost 10, Minton lost five and Minton lost another four to bring up fourth and 29. Porter kicked out to Midfield where Lipsey took the ball and wound his way across the Rotan goal for the fifth Cisco tally. The try for point was no good and the score stood at 33-0. The remainder of the third quarter was played on even keel with Lobo subs seeing most of the action.

The Rotan tally early in the fourth period was set up on a punt off the toe of Porter that put the Loboes deep in the hole. He kicked out of bounds on the Cisco 8, and after the series of plays the Loboes were on their own four facing fourth and 14. Buck Whitehead kicked out on the Cisco 24 and the Yellowhammers went to work. Minton carried for nine and Cisco drew a five yard penalty to place the ball on the 10. On the next play Minton went through the line for the score and Ashley failed to convert.

The final Cisco tally came on a beautiful run by Harold Pippen after he took a pitchout from Benji Lipsey on the Rotan 32. The entire play was executed beautifully with Lipsey faking to the full and tossing to Pippen who outran the defenders. Lipsey converted to bring the count to 40-6.
