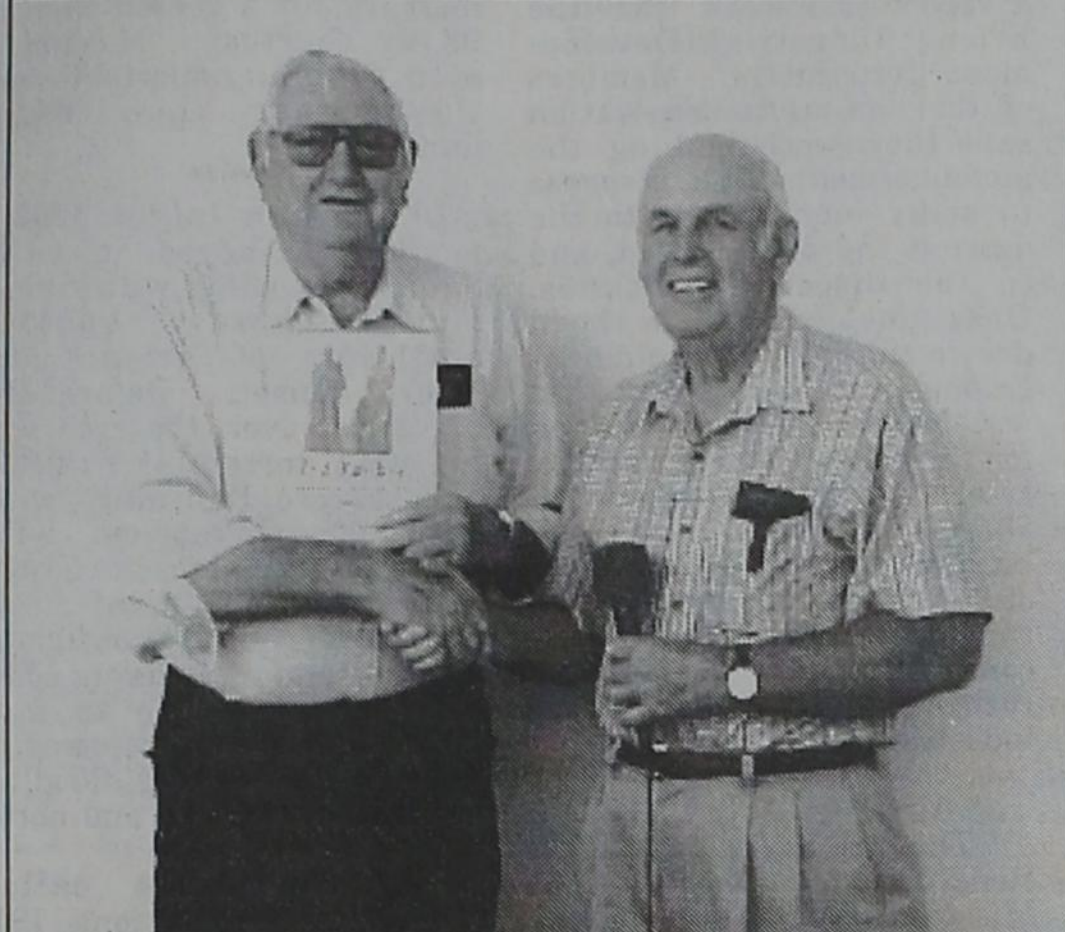

County's Cotton Yield For 2001 Led Region

Parmer County's cotton farmers led the region in bales and pounds per acre in the crop year of 2001. According to final production figures released last week by Plains Cotton Growers of Lubbock, Parmer's final bale count was 153,700. This is also easily an all-time record for the county in terms of bales produced.

The final tally was 13,000 bales more than the final estimate from the final survey of Parmer County gins conducted by the Friona Star/Bovina Blade. There is usually a difference in the two figures, since the survey contacts strictly the gins located in the county. There is usually an undetermined number of bales which are ginned across the county line.

Parmer County had 73,100 harvested acres from a planted acreage of 74,400. The yield averaged 1,009 pounds of lint per acre, for a count of 153,700 bales.

Nearest to Parmer County's yield was neighboring Castro County, with 938 pounds per acre. Castro outginned Parmer County by 3,300 bales, but only because the county harvested 80,300 acres of 81,700 planted.

The most acres planted by a single county was 309,000 in Dawson County, virtually all dryland. That county harvested 82,000 bales, which was 71,700 short of Parmer's total. Lynn County, south of Lubbock, planted 299,500 acres, but only harvested 110,300, which produced 61,500 bales.

Bill and Carol Ellis also own the Bovina Blade, another publication that serves Parmer County residents.

"Bill and Carol Ellis, throughout their careers, have kept Parmer County residents informed about important issues affecting them, their communities and beyond.

Although their talents could have taken their careers to larger-circulation publications, Parmer County remained home, which has been to the benefit of the

readers of the Bovina Blade and Friona Star.

"I would like to extend to Bill and Carol Ellis my thanks for their dedication to Parmer County residents, and I wish them well in their continued service to the public through providing informative and insightful coverage of Parmer County communities."

"We feel very humble to have been noticed and honored by Congressman Combest.

WE HAVE JUST celebrated the 226th anniversary of our nation's freedom, and also what seems to be the 226th increase in the cost of mailing a letter.

Actually, there haven't been that many rate increases. However, it is an increase of 1,233 per cent since our first class letters were mailed for three cents.

Some folks think that the U.S. Postal Service is pricing itself out of business. That may not be right, but the advent of FAX machines, as well as the internet, Fed-Ex and UPS have pretty well done away with many individuals' and companies' need to use the Postal Service when they want their messages and/or packages to be received in a timely manner.

One thing Ye Editor would like to be accomplished with the newest price hike in postage would be to get all of his mail on the same day it reaches our local post office.

The Friona Star has been in business for 77 years, and for the majority of that time, its post office box number has remain unchanged at #789. Yet, a week doesn't go by that we do not receive one or two items which bore our street address—a day later, mind you, with the stamped message "No Mail Receptacle." Often, such mail contains items which needed to be included in our current week's issue, but were not, because of the one-day delay in delivery.

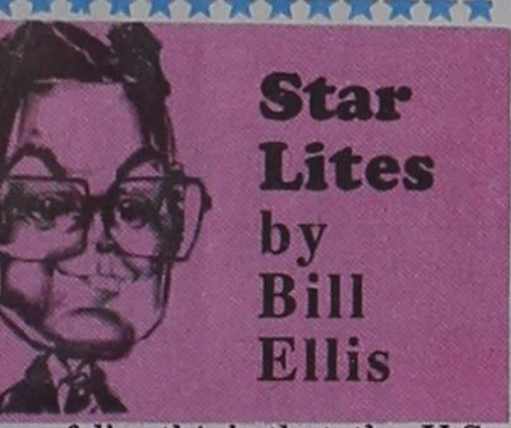
Here's the irony in this situation: We get UPS and Fed-Ex deliveries virtually on a daily basis. These delivery folks come to town from Amarillo or Plainview, and their personnel changes every so often. But after their second or third visit, they know every employee in our office, and deliver letters or packages to them along with that for our office.

Yet the post office folks, who have been here 1,233% longer, prefer to stamp letters "no mail receptacle," and make such mail a day late.

As a young man, Ye Editor worked in Lubbock's main post office building to help fund his college and family expenses. When a person starting sorting mail there, they were given typed cards (simulating mail), and learned to sort them according to where they should go to be delivered.

There were many items addressed to downtown businesses, such as the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, Hemphill-Wells, Triple-S Drug, etc. Mail sorters were required to put these cards into their proper BOX SECTIONS, even if there was a street address listed. We had to learn the box sections for such businesses, and Lubbock was just SLIGHTLY larger than our local towns.

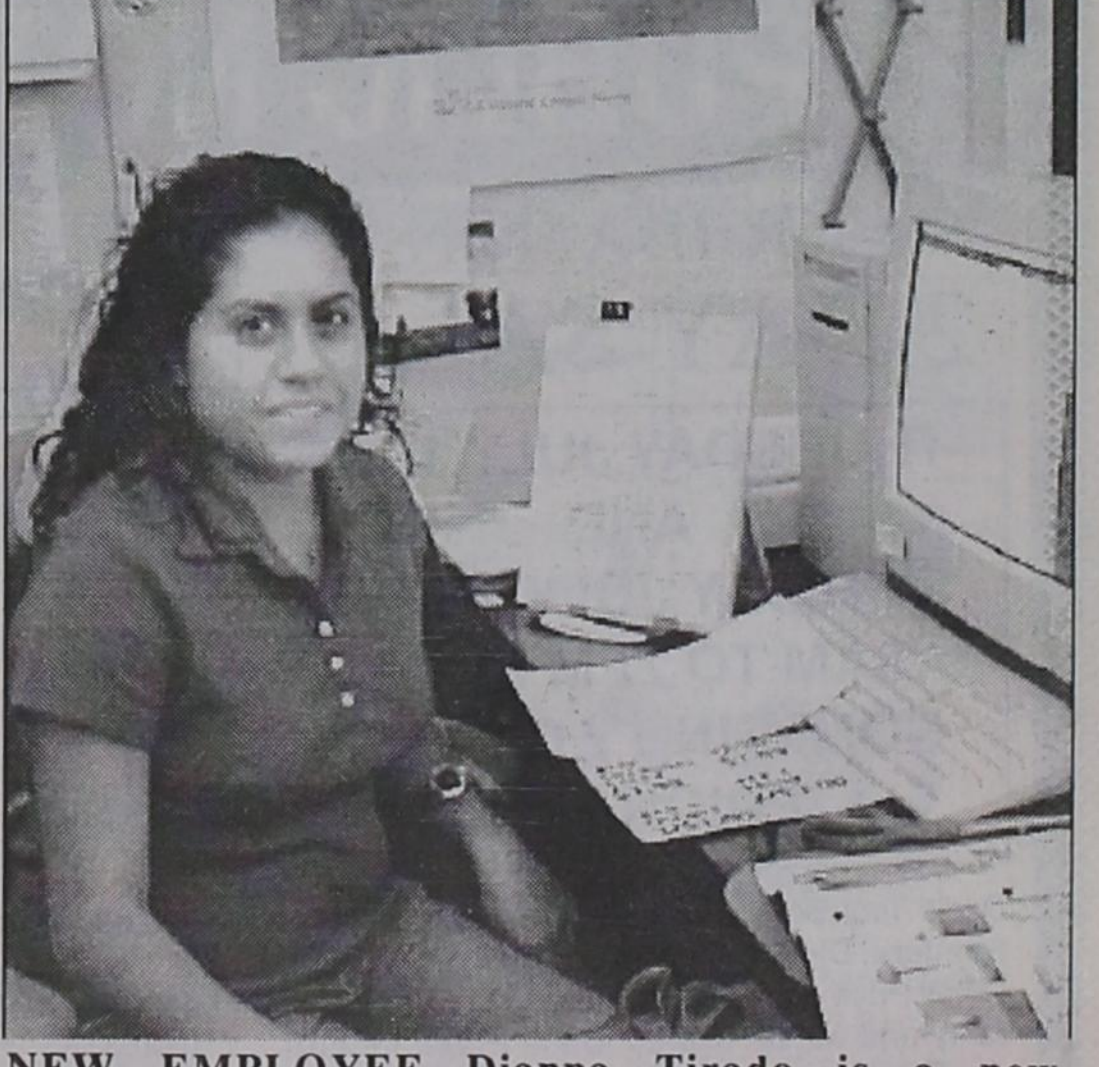
By the way, here's a puzzle. In Friona, one can have their mail delivered—either personal or business, to their street address, and there is no charge. However, if you choose to get your mail at a post office box, there is a charge. You have to make a trip down to the post office, and they charge YOU. If they bring it to your home or business, THEY pay for the gasoline. Where is the logic for this set-up?

Friona Flashbacks

...from the files of The Friona Star

70 Yrs Ago-July 8, 1932

Several weeks ago, Mayor Reeve called a meeting of any and all male citizens of Friona who would be willing to enlist in a volunteer fire department for Friona. It is painful to relate that not one man responded to the call, yet it appears that practically all of our people are strongly in favor of Friona having a fire department.

60 Yrs Ago-July 3, 1942

Sometime last Tuesday, a long and fairly comfortable bench was placed by someone in front of the Friona Post Office, for the convenience of those who have the spare time to loiter there. The ladies of Friona and the surrounding community are protesting the presence of the bench, as during the busy harvest season many of the wives or daughters come for the mail and they claim that there are already too many men loafing there to stare at them. The bench, they feel, invites more loafers.

50 Yrs Ago-July 3, 1952

Early signing of the right-to-way easements is necessary to expedite construction of the rural telephone line mapped for this area, Leo Forrest of Hereford has explained. Miss Mary Reeve is working on the project in the Rhea community. Contract for the construction of the lines is hoped for by July 30.

45 Yrs Ago-July 3, 1957

Contracts were let this week to Kerr and Middleton of Lubbock for constructing additional farm-to-market roads in Parmer County. Two projects are involved. One is from FM Road 690 at Oklahoma Lane south and southwest to the Bailey County line, where it will join another paved road already existing. The other will link Rhea with the two FM pavements running north of Bovina and west of Friona. The combined length of the two projects is about 14 miles.

A rattlesnake struck Monday afternoon from its hiding place in wheat stubble, biting Pamela Ann Jones, 13. She was treated in Parmer County Community Hospital and reported in satisfactory condition by officials at the hospital.

40 Yrs Ago-July 5, 1962

There have been a lot of unconfirmed reports about fish being found in irrigation ditches, barrow ditches and the like, but H.G. Houston, who farms three miles southeast of Friona, has gone them one better. Houston captured one of the phenomenon in an irrigation ditch on the J.L. Stowers farm Monday morning and brought it to the Friona Star office for photographing. The specimen was about two and one half inches long, and was sort of silvery colored, with flecks of gold.

35 Yrs Ago-July 6, 1967

The Friona Industrial fund drive brought in a total

of \$104,164.94, according to a report this week from the Friona Industrial Development Corporation. Members of the non-profit corporation said they were making the announcement in the response to many inquiries as to the amount the drive raised, and to the dispersal of funds. Only one check has been drawn from the account at Friona State Bank, and that was for the purchase of land for the Missouri Beef Packers' site, in the amount of \$95,000. This leaves a balance in the fund of \$9,164.94, which members of the corporation hope will continue to grow, for possible future use by prospective industries.

30 Yrs Ago-July 6, 1972

The striking employees of the Friona Division of Missouri Beef Packers, Inc. voted July 2, 1972 to end their five-month-old strike by accepting a new three-year contract. The employees are represented by local P-777 of Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen, AFL-CIO.

25 Yrs Ago-July 3, 1977

Parmer County once again rated high in the 1977 Fed Cattle Production report for the High Plains, compiled by Sam Thomas and the Agricultural Development Department of Southwestern Public Service. Parmer County had to settle for fourth for total cattle fed among Texas counties for 1976, with 282,062 head of cattle. Parmer's one-time capacity is 273,500, just below Deaf Smith's capacity.

15 Yrs Ago-July 4, 1987

The Great American Race, featuring 100 classic car entries, was slated to pass through Friona Friday (July 3) afternoon between 2:30 and 3 p.m. The Friona area has been sweltering in summer heat

during the past week. The mercury hit a season high of 95 on Thursday. Making it even more uncomfortable was the higher than usual humidity.

10 Yrs Ago-July 4, 1992

Storms moved in early Saturday evening with funnel clouds being spotted northwest of Friona just before sunset. Before the night was over, the area was hit with torrential rainfall, hail, severe lightning, wind and was threatened with several tornadoes. There were three confirmed tornadoes, one unconfirmed sighting and most likely some went unseen. Up to four inches of rain were received in some areas causing flooding northwest of Friona and north of Bovina.

At a special called meeting of the Friona ISD Board of Trustees on June 29, Kevin Wiseman was named the new principal at Friona Junior High School for the 1992-93 school year.

5 Yrs Ago-July 4, 1997

Parmer County's wheat harvest had reached or approached the half-way point as of Wednesday afternoon, the Friona Star learned. Joe Allen, manager of the Sherley Grain's Rhea elevator, said the dryland wheat was averaging from 25 to 30 bushels per acre, with some yields better. The longtime elevator manager said that it had been a smooth harvest to date, with the main problem being a shortage of combines for a time earlier in the week.

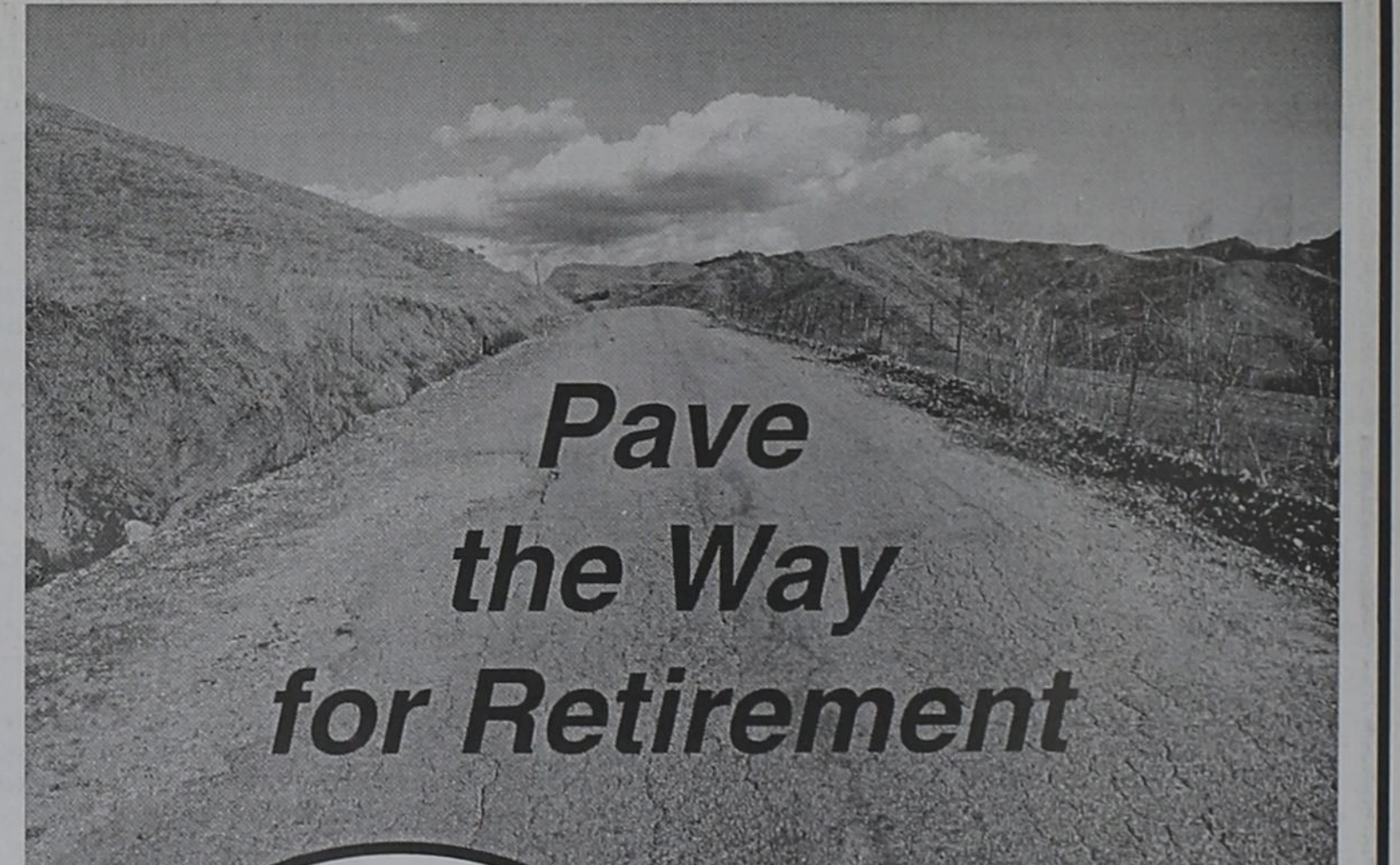

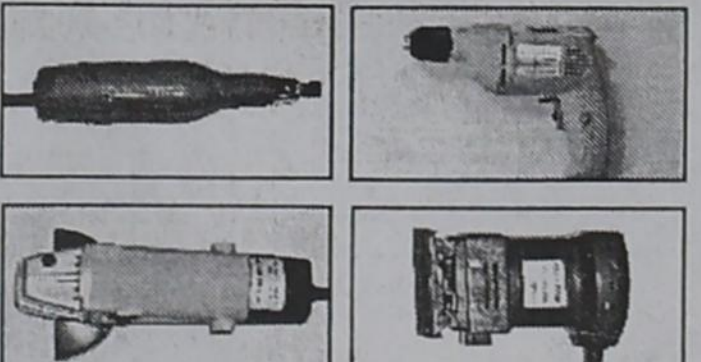

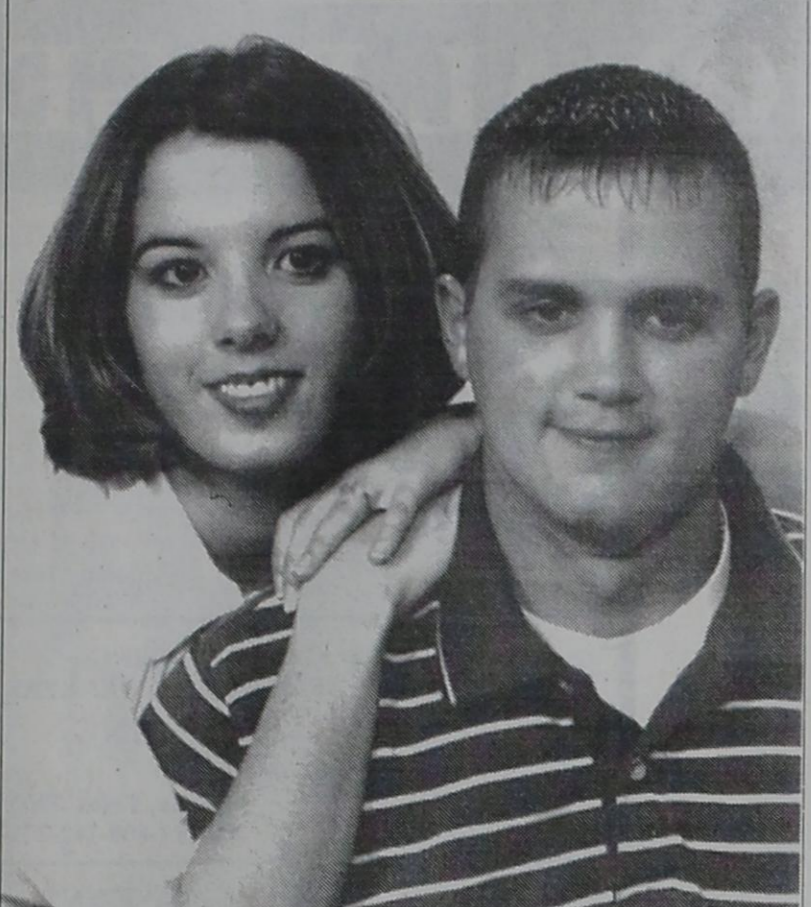

I am 85 years old and was born October 21, 1916 in Grayson County, Texas. I was the second of seven children born to John William and Ethyl Belle (Harrison) Short. I have three sisters and three brothers, Roscoe Allan (deceased), James Emmett (deceased), Alton Winston lives in Pea Ridge, Arkansas, Alice Short Dobson (deceased), Margart Geneva Short Corley (deceased) and Vista Mae Short lives in Oregon.

As children, we worked in the cotton fields most of our lives and didn't get much formal schooling. We went to carnivals sometimes!

We moved from Sherman County to Olney, Texas while we were all very young. We grew up there and stayed till we married.

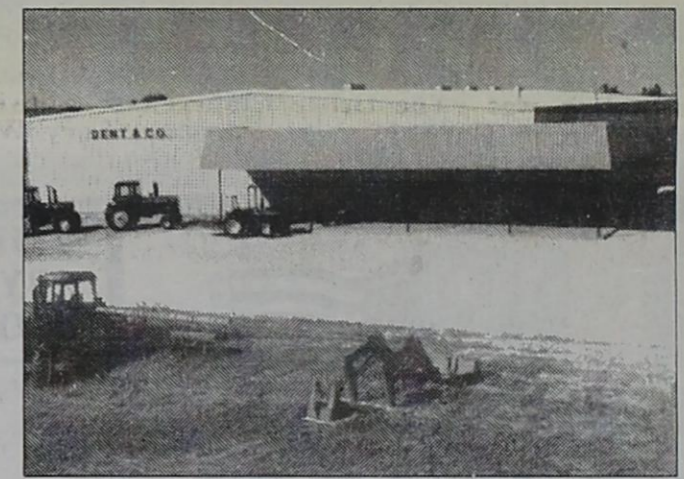

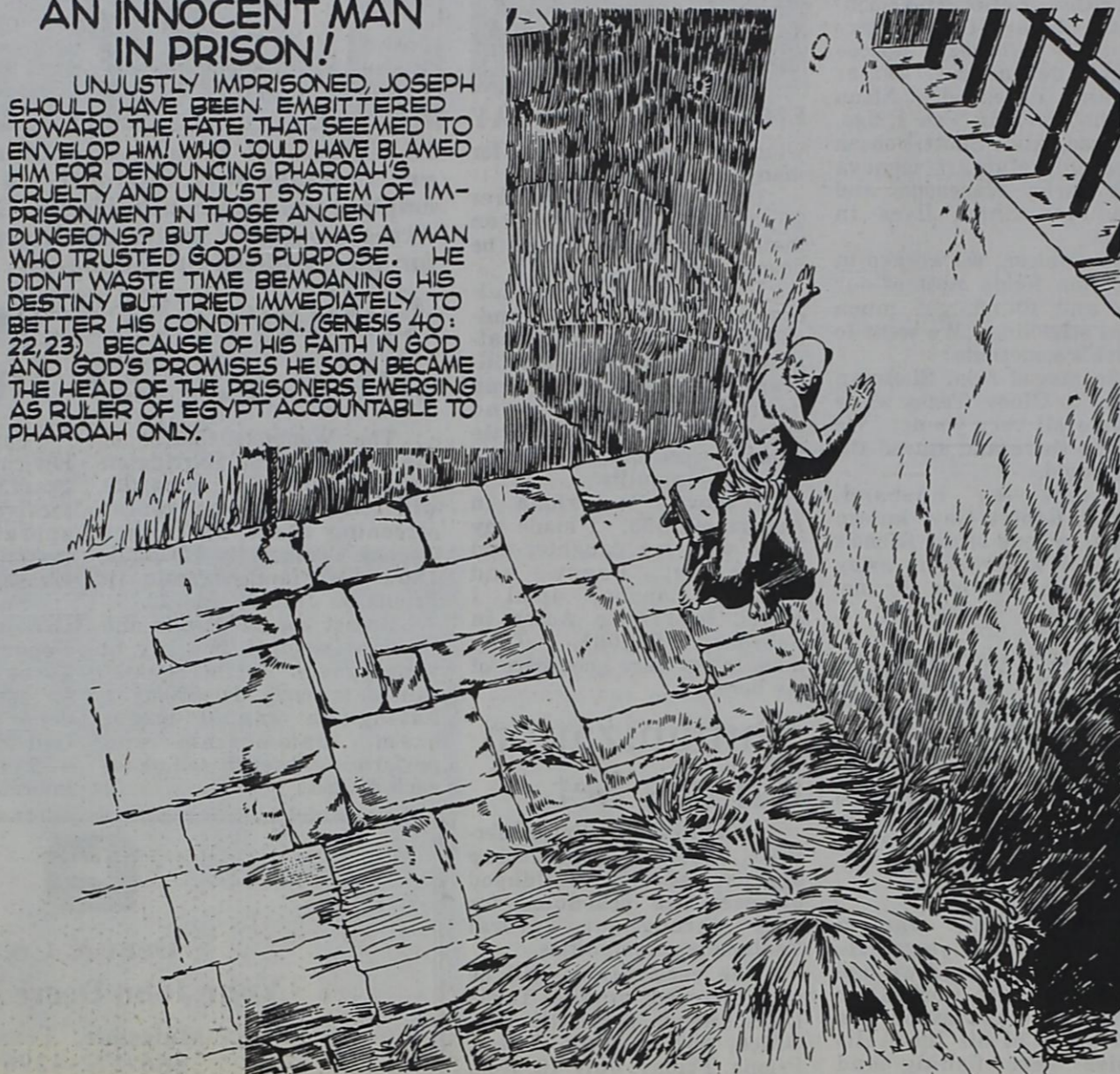

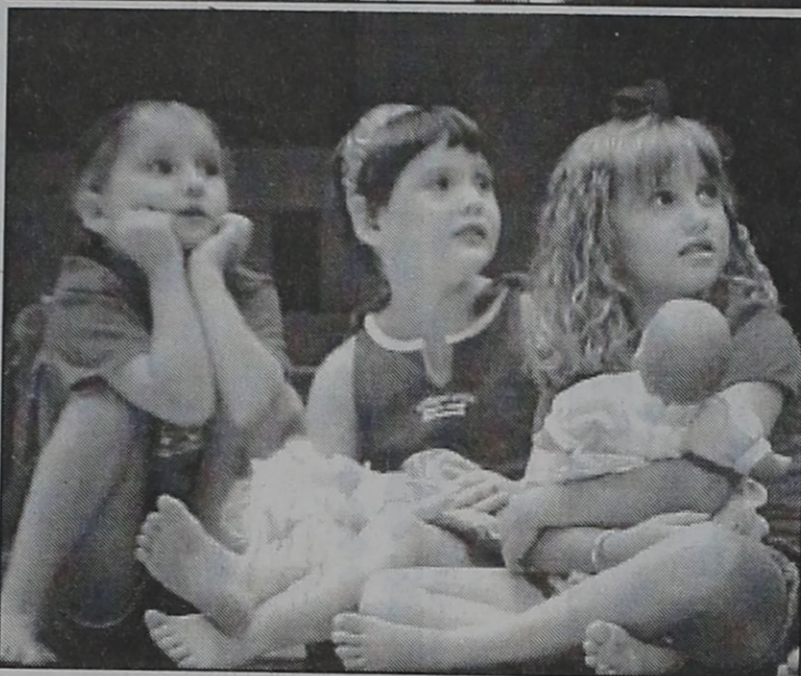

Eyeglass Frames and Lenses

More than 140 million people wear eyeglasses in the United States. Eyeglasses correct or improve the vision of people with nearsightedness, farsightedness, presbyopia and astigmatism. Plastic lenses, normally polycarbonate, are worn by individuals who are at risk of being in accidents that might shatter glass. Some occupations, such as manufacturing or electrical repair, require these safety lenses and safety frames. Polycarbonate, also used for space shuttle windshields, is about 50 times stronger than other lens materials.

Eyeglasses come in an almost unlimited variety of shapes, colors and sizes. Frames can be made from metal or plastic. Some eyeglasses are rimless. The amount of correction in the eye often determines the frame that is used. Some thicker lenses are not suitable for metal rims, for example. After an eyecare professional checks your eyes, discuss the frames that are best suited to your needs. If this is the first time you have worn glasses, it may take a couple of days to adjust to the changes. By

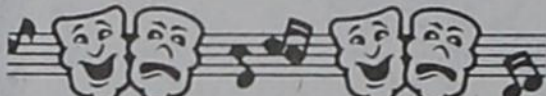
