Air Force Seeks To Hire Auditors

The Air Force is looking for Auditors who can qualify for positions paying as much as \$10,000 per year. This was disclosed by the Board of United States Civil Service Examiners.

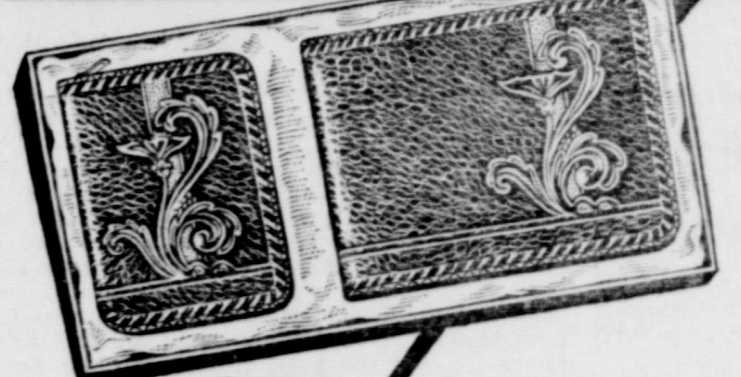
