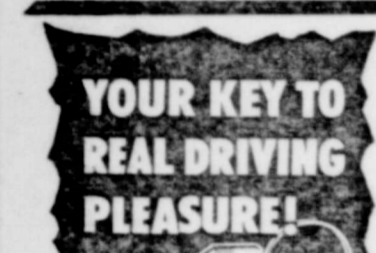

A PROGNOSIS

Eggs are too cheap, our poultry farmers are not making any money. Many farmers are selling their entire flocks. In fact I think that is the thing to do. The egg market will continue low until about May, then start up. This is just history repeating itself.

If you want to make egg profits in '55, start a good flock of pullets in February. Have them laying in July, and you will make money.

In Texas, the Texas Safety Association and Department of Public Safety are not asking motorists to sign written pledges, but E. B. Rooper of Houston, Chief Safety Engineer, Humble Oil & Refining Company and President of the Texas Safety Association, Inc., and Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., Director of the Department of Public Safety have issued a joint appeal for each driver in the state to make a "Pact" with himself agreeing to adhere to the basic rules of driving courtesy.

But let us not forget that it's not the pacts themselves, that are important. It's the thinking behind the agreements that counts. Each agreement represents a driver who is convinced that courtesy on the road is a must and who believes it so strongly that he pledges himself to live up to the rules of courtesy at all times.

The objective of the program is to get 100 per cent of our drivers thinking this way. That would follow naturally if every driver realized two important facts. The first is that the line between discourtesy and traffic law violation is a thin one, and it is often difficult to tell when it is crossed. The second is that there is a very definite relationship between traffic law violations and traffic accidents.

Realizing that his own safety and the safety of all he meets in traffic depends to a great extent on his courteous conduct, no driver should have any difficulty in living up to his pledge of courteous driving.

PLANTATION SUPPER

- 1 1/4 cups sifted flour, 1/2 cup yellow corn meal, 2 tablespoons sugar, 4 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 egg, 1/2 cup milk, 3/4 cup melted margarine, 1 pound bulk pork sausage, 2 1/2 pounds fresh asparagus OR 1 pkg. frozen asparagus spears, 2 1/2 cups medium white sauce.

While corn bread bakes, prepare other parts of dish. Fry sausage in skillet over low heat, stirring with fork to break up larger pieces.

When corn bread is done, cut it into squares. Split each square and place lower half on hot plate. Cover with cooked sausage, then with top of corn bread square. Arrange 3 or 4 stalks of asparagus on top of corn bread, and pour cream sauce over. If desired, garnish each serving with a strip of pimiento or a dash of paprika. Serve hot.

One thing should be of uppermost importance in the life of every homemaker. That is the health and well being of her family. One of the biggest contributions she can make is to start her family off on their daily activities with a good breakfast. Breakfast need not be large to be adequate, but for maximum efficiency and alertness, breakfast is essential.

Serving nutritious, attractive breakfast can be so easy for the modern homemaker. Take advantage of the many time-saving packaged biscuit, muffin, and coffee cake mixes on the market. Then, too, a variety of tempting hot breads can be served with a minimum of effort. Use your imagination when it comes to the "extras" in the form of toppings and fillings.

Here is a good apple topping for a quick coffee cake: Arrange 2 or 3 medium apples, sliced, over a quick coffee cake batter which has been spread in a baking pan. Brush apples with 2 T. melted butter or margarine. Mix together 1/4 cup sugar and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon and sprinkle over the apples. Bake according to recipe directions.

When you serve hot waffles for breakfast, you'll be assured of perfect attendance. For an especially tasty treat, substitute bacon drippings for the shortening in your favorite waffle recipe and add 1/2 cup partially cooked, chopped bacon. Serve these delightful Bacon Waffles with butter or margarine and hot maple syrup.

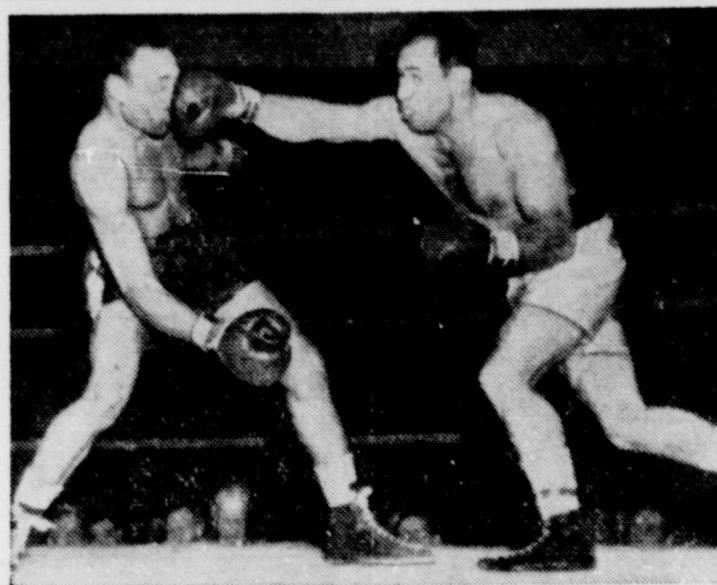
Hot buttered toast is an American breakfast tradition. For a pleasing change from the usual jam or jelly spread, make a bowl of honey topping. Cream to-

gether 1/4 cup butter or margarine, 2/3 cup confectioners sugar, 1 egg white, and 2 T. honey, warmed. Honey topping is delicious baked right on coffee cakes and rolls too.

Fresh oranges should be plentiful on the market from now until May. Valencias have been found best for juice. In selecting your oranges choose those that are round or slightly oval, medium to large in size with a deep golden color, and the skin should be smooth or slightly pebbled. Besides juice, oranges are excellent for snacks, lunch pails, fruit salads, desserts, and sherbets.

Sometimes we find milk to be rather expensive when we have to purchase it. Milk is one of our most nearly perfect foods and a sufficient amount should be included in the diet every day. Dry milk products are excellent foods, and they can help families get enough milk for good health at a moderate cost. There are two forms of dry milk products — nonfat and whole milk. Nonfat dry milk has the fat removed, but it still contains the calcium with other minerals, natural sugar, high quality protein, and Vitamin B. When nonfat milk is used Vitamin A may be supplied in the diet by other foods such as green and leafy vegetables. Whole dry milk has Vitamin A in addition, because the cream has not been removed. Dry milk is economical, easy to prepare, and easy to store. We find a pinch of salt added to the dry milk that we drink makes it very tasty. It has many uses. Try it sometimes, won't you.

Each day in our lives we should devote at least a small portion of that day toward doing good for others. Usually we find by making others happy, that we too will receive some of this happiness. Let's not forget to shine through — not only to our loved ones and friends, but to everyone around us.

RESCUE OPERATIONS TRAINING COURSE PLANNED BY COLLEGE

Austin, Feb. 8. — If you want to be a civil defense worker — or want to be a better one — you will be interested in a rescue operations training course which will begin February 13 for organizational representatives in this state.

The course will be held at the State Rescue Training School at Texas A & M College. It will be given over a six-day period which ends February 18.

The man in charge of the institution — he is Colonel H. R. Brayton, director of the Firemen's Training School at A. & M. College — said the first 28 applications received by his office, unless noted for later courses, will make up the first class.

The Colonel also pointed out that the courses are planned for potential instructors in rescue operations in the civil defense and disaster relief programs of counties, cities and towns, in addition to industries and institutions. Enrollment is restricted to males.

Anyone interested should get a written certificate or endorse-

ment of a judge, mayor, or civil defense and disaster relief director in his community.

Applications should be mailed to Colonel Brayton, State Rescue Training School, Firemen's Training School, A. & M. College, College Station.

The instruction will be given by experts under intensely realistic conditions. A Disaster Street — one which is a replica of a city area which could have been hit by a bomb or tornado — has been built specifically for the school.

The buildings on Disaster Street are in varying stages of destruction. A number of exercises are planned to give students the most realistic training possible.

Tuition is free. Colonel Brayton said that rooms are available for students enrolled in the first class at Memorial Center. Rates are \$7.00 per room or \$3.50 per person, with two to a room. Hotel or motel accommodations in Bryan are also available.

The classes will be offered four times during the winter and

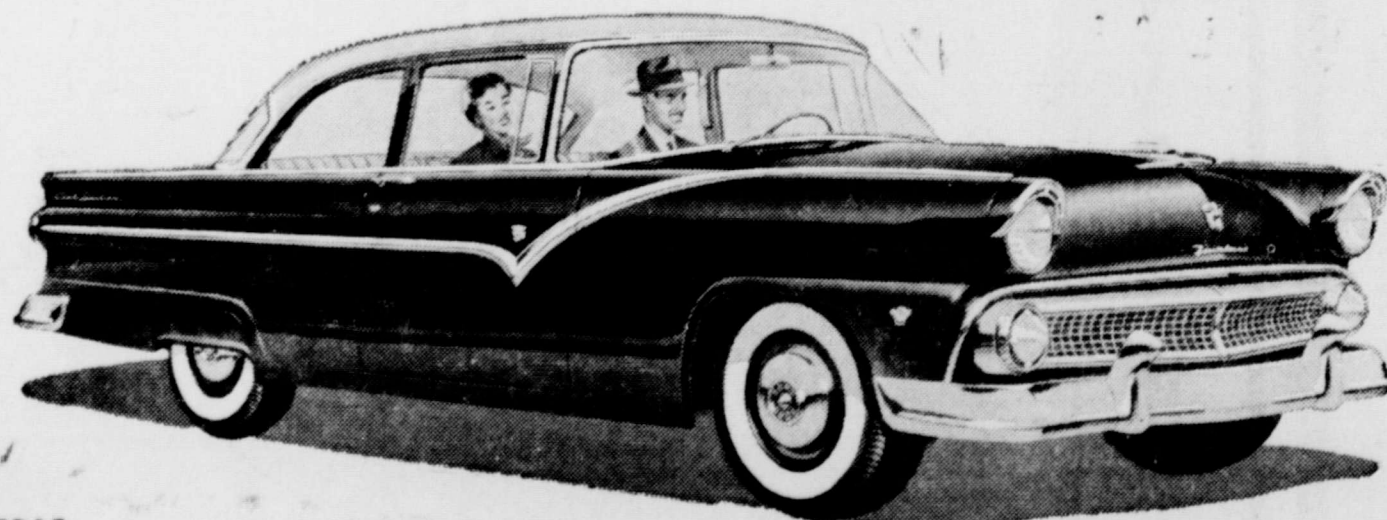
