

More Teachers Are Needed, Dean Says

FORT WORTH, Feb. 12. - Texas needs 8,000 more qualified school teachers at once and 2,000 additional instructors will be required each year to care for increasing enrollments, Dean Otto Nielson of the TCU School of Education said this week.

"Last year, over 4,000 left the profession," he pointed out, "while Texas colleges and universities graduated only 4,000 persons certified to teach. We didn't break even. By the opening of school next fall, it is estimated Texas will need 10,000 new qualified teachers with only some 4,000 available for appointment."
