Advance of Freight Rate not Needed Now

## Facts and Figures Given to Need to Be Raised

Discussing the recent notice of the Soe ireight rates on inte state shipments to Texas points, Wallace's Farmer says
"Some months ago the various railroad associations announced that they would make an ad vance in rates equivalent to about 10 per cent. This was bit terly opposed by the manufac turing and agricultural inter ests.
meeting in Chicago May 15 and meeting in Chicago May or fight the measur from the drop of the hat. The announcement was then made that the proposed advance had been abandoned, and the produc ing interests felt easy again. The railroads have been quietly saw ing wood, however. In othe
words, they have been organiz words, they have been organiz
ing for the battle, and the South ing for the battle, and the South short time ago filed a new tarifí schedule affecting all oint rates in Texas on all railorads and from all territories. This move is understood to heve been mad with the sanction of the Centra and Southeastern Freight Asso as the first bun of the battle ${ }^{\text {as }}$ As throwing an interesting sidelight on the need for this advance in rates we give an ab stract from the report of the In terstate Commerce Commissio for the year ending June 30 1907. From this it apepars tha there was a large increase in passenger and freight earnings.
There was an increase of 10,892 miles of track. The total sala ries and wages paid were $\$ 1$ $072.386,427$. The passeng traffic exceeded that of the pre vious year by almost $\$ 76,000$, 000 ; the freight traffic increa ed $165,000,000$ tons, or 69,718 revenue per mile averaged 2.18 cents, and both passenger and
freight earnings per mile show ed an increase. The gross earn ings from the portion of the line plete returns are given com $\$ 263,000,000$ greater than th previous year. There was an in crease in perating evpenses o over $\$ 211,000,000$, and an in crease of net of over $\$ 51,700,00$ for the year. The dividends de clared aggregated $\$ 308,137,92$ leaving a surplus of $141,323,26$ from the profits of the year, as compared with a profit of
334,761 the previous year.
This resume of the operation of the year ending June 30 , 1907 aken, as it is, from authorita ive sources, is about the best ar gument that can be made against he increase in freight rates a this time.
