weet ruddy lip of the maiden and impled cheek of the sleeping child The germs it carries may cau typhoid fever and dysentry.
The fly is denounced by modern anitary science as dangerous to health as well as comfort and it is therefore a common enemy. Keep
it out of the house by ssreening it out of the house by ssreening
and by all possible means exterminate it. See that stables are cleaned and disinfected. Leave no filth about the premises for the fly to breed in; leave no food uncoyered for it to feed on. It is a hard job to get rid of the pest entirely, but perseverance will do it, just like it has done with the mosquito in the jellow ever country.-Ex.
