The fly is denounced by modern sanitary science as dangerous to health as well as comfort and it is therefore a common enemy. Keep it out of the house by screening and by all possible means exterminate it. See that stables are cleaned and disinfected. Leave no filth about the premises for the fly to breed in; leave no food uncovered for it to feed on. It is a hard job to get rid of the pest entirely, but perseverance will do it, just like it has done with the mosquito in the yellow fever country .- Ex.
