Crockett, Tuxas, June 14.-W F. Procter, of the Governmen Department of Agriculture spoke Saturday at the farmers here las Siscussed the matter of finiehing
diarday the present crop and the bol weevil. He said we, as a rule,
laid by too quick and did not cultivate enougn. Corn should have been plowed lightly after the late heavy rains so as to prevent the baking of the surface and to keep moisture coming up thereby feeding the stalks at the very time they need it so as to make good large ears of corn soil, but a pulverized surface insures moisture and nutrition. The cotton should be plowed oftener
and planted in wider rows, so as to let in the hot sun. In plowing the cotton from now on he ap pealed to them to try a brush or a chain or pole tied to the single tree to knock the boll weevils of into the hot sand and wateh him die.
