They say that the squares are punctured as soon as formed, and are at once thiown off This shedding is attributed by ome to the numerous showers which have been falling followed y very hot daye, but a number ated that they had made exminations of the squares which had fallen off, and they found in almost every instance the weevi the squares.
About the only method so aar discovered by the farmers here to overcome the ravages of this pest is continuous plowing, and this course will be pursued by them.
